Boilermakers head to Maryland for first road game of 2016

The game is Purdue's first in the Old Line State since 1944.

»GAME THEMES

- Purdue and Maryland meet for their first regular-season meeting in series history.
- The Boilermakers and Terrapins have played just once previously, with Maryland beating Purdue 24-7 in the 2006 Champs Sports Bowl.
- Purdue makes its first trip to the state of Maryland since 1944 when the 14th-ranked Boilermakers fell to No. 3 Navy 32-0 in Baltimore.
- Purdue also played in the Old Line State in 1926 when it lost at Navy 17-13.
- Purdue is coming off a 24-14 win over Nevada, while Maryland is coming off a bye week.
- Saturday's game is the first Big Ten game of the season for both teams.
- Maryland is one of Purdue's three Big Ten crossover games (also Oct. 29 vs. Penn State and Nov. 26 at Indiana).
- The Boilermakers exit September with a winning record for the first time since 2012.
- David Blough is looking to tie a program record with three consecutive 300-yard passing games, while Markell Jones is looking to become the first Boilermaker running back with back-to-back 100-yard rushing games since Akeem Shavers in 2012.

»UNDER CENTER: DAVID BLOUGH

- David Blough was named the starting quarterback Aug. 22 after starting eight games last season.
- Blough, a third-year sophomore, has appeared in 13 games and has completed 247 of 423 passes (.584) for 2,520 yards with 15 touchdowns and 15 interceptions.
- Blough is Purdue's sixth different opening-day starting quarterback in the last six years. No Purdue quarterback has started the season opener in consecutive years since Curtis Painter in 2006, 2007 and 2008.

- Blough's first start came last season against Bowling Green. He went 29 for 39 for 340 yards and two touchdowns, while also rushing for 11 yards and a score.
- Blough became the 20th quarterback in Purdue history to throw for at least 300 yards in a game.

- The 25 completions put him on Purdue's top-20 career list for the first time.

DARRELL HAZELL FILE



Darrell Hazell was named the 35th head coach in Purdue football history on Dec. 5, 2012. He signed a six-year contract with the Boilermakers. Hazell is in his fourth year at Purdue after spending two seasons as the head coach at Kent State.

Hazell (HAY-zull) was named the 2012 Mid-American Conference Coach of the Year after leading Kent State to arguably its most successful season ever, with an 11-3 record and MAC East Division championship. The 11 wins set a school record.

Prior to his time at Kent State, Hazell spent seven seasons at Ohio State, where he served as an assistant head coach and wide receivers coach under Jim Tressel. Hazell has spent 30 years in the college coaching ranks, and has previous stints as Rutgers (2001-03), West Virginia (1999-2000), the U.S. Military Academy (1997-98), Western Michigan (1995-96), Pennsylvania (1992-94), Eastern Illinois (1988) and Oberlin (1986-87, 1989-91).

Hazell graduated in 1986 from Muskingum College with a B.A. in speech communications and business. He was a three-time all-conference selection as a wide receiver and an All-American as a senior.

A native of Cinnaminson, New Jersey, Hazell (born April 14, 1964) and Annmarie have a son, Kyle.

CONFERENCE ROAD OPENERS

Darrell Hazell is looking for his second win in three years in the first conference road game of the year. Purdue beat Illinois 38-27 in 2014, before falling at No. 2 Michigan State 24-21 last year.

- Blough has 78 completions in 130 attempts for 946 yards, five touchdowns and seven interceptions this season.
- His 21 completions against Nevada moved him from 20th to 18th on the career completions list.

- Blough has 423 career pass attempts, which makes him eligible for the career completion percentage list in Purdue history (min. 300 attempts).
- He is currently ninth in program history, completing 58.4 percent of his passes.
- Blough rushed for two touchdowns in the season opener against Eastern Kentucky, a career high. He now has six career rushing touchdowns.
- Blough is nearing the top-20 lists for passing attempts and passing yards.

- Blough threw for at least 300 yards against Cincinnati and Nevada, making him the first Purdue quarterback with back-to-back 300-yard passing games since Joey Elliott in 2009 (367 at Michigan; 373 at Michigan State).
- Blough is trying to become just the fifth quarterback in Purdue history to have three straight 300-yard passing games.
- Blough is looking for his first road win as a starting quarterback.
- Blough has three 300-yard passing games in his career, which ties him for

eighth-most in school history.

- Blough leads the Big Ten in total offense per game with 334.3 yards per game. That figure ranks 19th in the country.
- He is 16th in the country with 315.3 passing yards per game, which is second in the Big Ten.
- He is ninth in the country with 26.0 completions per game.

»FIRST(S) AND 10

- David Blough is first in the Big Ten with 26.0 completions per game.
- Purdue is first in the Big Ten in third-down conversion offense. The Boilermakers convert 59.2 percent of their third-down opportunities.
- The Boilermakers are first in the Big Ten in fewest penalties per game with 2.67 per contest.
- Purdue is first in the Big Ten allowing just 0.33 sacks per game.
- Purdue's first scoring drive against Nevada was 15 plays, spanning 6:50. That is the first 15-play scoring drive since Sept. 6, 2014, against Central Michigan and first scoring drive of at least as long since Oct. 4, 2014, against Illinois.
- Purdue has 79 first downs through its first three games, an average of 26.3 per game.
- Against Nevada, Purdue had its first 300-yard passer and 100-yard rusher in the same game since Sept. 7, 2013, against Indiana State. Blough threw for 300 yards and Markell Jones rushed for 124.
- The Boilermakers held Nevada scoreless in the second half. That's the first time Purdue has done so since Sept. 1, 2012, against Eastern Kentucky.
- Brian Lankford-Johnson had his first career kickoff return against Nevada. It went for 45 yards, which is the first time the Boilermakers have had one at least that long since Nov. 16, 2013, when Raheem Mostert had a 100-yard return for a touchdown.
- Evan Panfil picked up his first sack of the season against Nevada. He finished the game with 2.0 sacks and 4.0 tackles for loss.

»GAME THREE REWIND

- Purdue knocked off Nevada 24-14.
- David Blough passed for 300 yards and two touchdowns, with one interception.
- Markell Jones had his second 100-yard rushing game of the season, finishing the day with 22 carries for 124 yards.
- After not losing a fumble through the first two games of the year, the

»FRESHMAN NUMBERS

- Markell Jones led the team in rushing last season with 168 carries for 875 yards and 10 touchdowns. The 875 yards are the most ever by a Purdue freshman.
- Jones ran for 157 yards and two touchdowns at No. 2 Michigan State last year. That is the most single-game yardage by a true freshman in program history. That was his first career start.
- Jones' 10 rushing touchdowns were the most by a Boilermaker since 2008, when Kory Sheets had 16, and rank tied for 15th-most in a season in program history.

»RANKINGS

- Jones is one of just two B1G running backs back this year who rushed for 10+ touchdowns in 2015. Jones had 10, MSU's LJ Scott had 11.
- Jones ranks fourth in rushing yards for returning Big Ten running backs from last year. His 875 yards are only fewer than Northwestern's Justin Jackson 1,418, Penn State's Saquon Barkley's 1,076 and Indiana's Devine Redding's 1,012.
- Jones' 5.21 yards-per-carry average ranks third in the conference among returning running backs behind only Barkley (5.91 ypc) and Rutgers' Robert Martin (5.41 ypc).
- Jones is one of just 12 returning Power 5 running backs to rush for at least 875 yards and 10 touchdowns last season. Among that list, he is one of just three who are now sophomores.

»MORE

- Jones was named to the Doak Walker Watch List for the nation's premier running back for achievements on the field, in the classroom and in the community.
- In Jones' 168 carries last year, just seven went for loss - all 1-yard losses.
- Against Cincinnati, he had 15 carries for 47 yards, before a shoulder injury sidelined him for the rest of the game.
- Jones already has two 100-yard rushing games this season, after putting up 124 on Nevada.
- Jones is just two rushing touchdowns shy of cracking Purdue's top-20 career list.
- He needs 397 yards to jump into Purdue's top-20 career rushing yards list.

»2016 NUMBERS

- Jones led the Big Ten in week one with 145 rushing yards.
- Jones' rushing total is the fourth best for a Boilermaker in a season-opening game.
- Jones went over 1,000 career rushing yards against ECU and now has 1,191 after the Nevada game.
- Jones has 61 carries for 316 yards (5.2 avg.) and two touchdowns this season.
- Even with his injury that knocked him out of the Cincinnati game, Jones is third in the conference and 26th in the country in rushing yards per game with 105.3.
- Jones is looking to become the first Boilermaker with back-to-back 100-yard rushing games since Akeem Shavers did so in the final two games of 2012.

Boilermakers lost three fumbles against Nevada.

- Purdue outgained Nevada 466-253 in total yards.
- The 466 yards marked the third straight game of at least 400 yards of total offense, the first time the Boilermakers have done so since having at least as many in the first four games of the 2007 season.
- Nevada's 253 yards were the fewest by a Purdue opponent since Eastern Kentucky had 190 on Sept. 1, 2012.
- Purdue did not punt in the game, the first time the Boilermakers have done so since Nov. 22, 2008, when Purdue beat Indiana 62-10.
- Da'Wan Hunte and Austin Larkin played in their first game of the year after missing the first two with injury. Hunte started and led the team with eight tackles, including 1.0 for loss, while Larkin had one of Purdue's five

sacks.

- Purdue trailed 14-3 before scoring the game's final 21 points. It was Purdue's largest comeback win since defeating Michigan 38-36 on Nov. 7, 2009, after it trailed 24-10 at halftime.
- Purdue gave up its first sack of the season. It was one of the last five teams in the country to not have yielded a sack.
- Turnovers again were a factor, giving up three fumbles and an interception, which led to all 14 Nevada points. In the last two games, Purdue has lost nine turnovers and has not had a takeaway, leading to 35 of 52 points allowed.
- Entering the game, Purdue had just four tackles for loss. Against Nevada, the Boilermakers had 11, including five sacks.
- After starting just 2 of 5 passing with an interception, David Blough

COUNTDOWN TO KICKOFF

12 David Blough is 12 completions shy of 17th on Purdue's career list.

11 DeAngelo Yancey is 11 receiving yards shy of 19th on Purdue's all-time list.

10 The game between Maryland and Purdue comes 10 years after the teams met for the first time in the Champs Sports Bowl.

9 Blough is nine passing attempts shy of cracking Purdue's all-time top-20 list.

8 Markell Jones ranks eighth in school history with an average of 5.20 yards per carry for his career.

7 Purdue's defense has allowed third-down conversions on seven of 24 attempts in second halves of games this season.

6 Averaging just over six catches per game (6.3), Domonique Young ranks 19th in the country and second in the Big Ten.

5 The Boilermakers rank fifth in the country in fewest penalty yards per game with 30.3.

4 Purdue is fourth in the country in sacks allowed per game with 0.33.

JA'WHAUN BENTLEY

»CAREER NUMBERS

- Ja'Whaun Bentley has 140 tackles, 13.0 for loss, three fumble recoveries and an interception in his 20-game career.
- Bentley led the team with 49 tackles, including 7.5 for loss, through the first five games last season before a season-ending injury.
- Bentley still finished seventh on the team in tackles.
- He had a career-high 14 tackles, including nine solo and a half tackle for loss, and two PBUs last year against Bowling Green.

»HEALTHY

- Bentley tore his ACL last season before Purdue's game against Minnesota. He missed the final seven games of the year.
- This year, he's back healthy and ready to anchor the middle of the defense.
- When Bentley was healthy last year, the Boilermaker defense gave up 193 rush yards and 33 points per game, including games against four bowl teams and No. 2 Michigan State.
- After his injury, the Boilermakers gave up an average of 231 rush yards and 40 points per game.

»MORE

- Bentley was voted a captain by his

teammates for the second straight year.

- As a sophomore captain a year ago, he was the youngest-ever captain for Darrell Hazell.
- Bentley has started every game that he has been healthy for since coming to Purdue in 2014. Saturday will be his 21st start.
- Bentley averaged 9.8 tackles per game last year before his injury. That number would have ranked 17th-best in the country last season, had he played enough games for his total to qualify.
- Bentley's 9.8 tackles per game would be tied for eighth among players who returned this season, third among returning players from Power 5 Conferences and second among returning Big Ten players (Rutgers' linebacker Steve Longa averaged 10.6 tackles per game).
- Bentley opened the 2016 season with eight tackles apiece against Eastern Kentucky, which tied for the team high, and Cincinnati.
- His 8.0 tackles per game ranks eighth in the Big Ten this season.
- Bentley had his first two tackles for loss of the season against Nevada. That was the second-best on the team.

completed 19 of his last 25 passes for 272 yards and two touchdowns.

- J.D. Dellinger made a 36-yard field goal, the longest of his young career.
- Evan Panfil had 2.0 sacks and 4.0 tackles for loss.
- Bilal Marshall had career highs in receptions (5) and yards (82) and also scored his first career touchdown.
- Brycen Hopkins had his first career reception on Purdue's final drive, when he hauled in a 51-yard touchdown.
- Nevada entered the game averaging 208.3 rushing yards per game and Purdue held the Wolf Pack to just 68.

»2006 CHAMPS SPORTS BOWL REWIND

- Purdue and Maryland's only meeting came at the end of the 2006 season in Orlando, Florida.
- The Terrapins jumped out to a 21-0 second-quarter lead before Curtis Painter found Greg Orton with 30 seconds left in the half for the Boilermakers' only touchdown.





JAKE REPLOGLE

»**CAREER NUMBERS**

- Jake Replogle has amassed 131 career tackles, 27.5 tackles for loss, 5.5 sacks, three PBU's and a blocked field goal.
- Replogle's 27.5 tackles for loss rank 19th in Purdue history.
- He is just 1.5 tackles for loss shy of 16th on the all-time Purdue list.
- He has started 27 straight games and appeared in 34 straight contests.
- Had a career-high 11 tackles against Indiana last season.

»**LAST YEAR**

- Replogle was fourth on the team with 60 total tackles. That was the most by a lineman and 28 more than the next best effort by a lineman (Gelen Robinson).
- Replogle started all 12 games, something he has done two seasons in a row.
- Replogle was tied for third on the team with 2.0 sacks a year ago.
- His 14.0 tackles for loss were five more than anyone else on the team registered in 2015.
- His 1.2 tackles for loss per game was among the best for defensive linemen in the country.

»**ACCOLADES**

- Replogle is a two-time Academic All-

- Painter finished the game with 264 yards passing, giving him a Big Ten-record 3,985 for the season.
- Maryland went on to win 24-7.

»**CONNECTING THE SCHOOLS**

- Purdue director of sports performance Duane Carlisle was a track athlete at the University of Maryland in the late 1980s. An accomplished triple jumper, Carlisle still owns the No. 2 mark in Maryland school history in the indoor and outdoor event.
- Purdue junior middle linebacker Ja'Whaun Bentley is from Bethesda, Maryland, and attended DeMatha Catholic with six Terrapins. Freshmen wide receivers D.J. Turner and Tino Ellis, freshman running back Lorenzo Harrison III, junior wide receiver Chris Jones, freshman defensive lineman Seun Oluwatimi and freshman offensive lineman Terrance Davis all also were at DeMatha.
- Maryland freshman quarterback Max Bortenschlager attended Cathedral High School in Indianapolis with four Boilermakers. Sophomore punter Joe Schopper, senior linebacker Evan Pulliam, redshirt freshman safety

Big Ten selection.

- This season, he was named to three watch lists: The Bednarik, Lombardi and Outland.
- Replogle was voted a captain by his teammates Aug. 19.

»**MORE**

- Replogle anchors a defensive line that returns three of the four starters from last year (also DE Evan Panfil and RE Gelen Robinson).
- The defensive line boasts 56 career starts led by Replogle's 27.
- Replogle's year-by-year stats have seen consistent improvement from 1.9 tackles per game as a freshman to 3.3 per game as a sophomore (+1.4) and 5.0 as a junior (+1.7) in 2015. This year, he has 6.0 tackles per game.
- Replogle's brothers, Tyler, Mike and Adam, all played football at Indiana.
- Replogle's biggest game statistically last year was at No. 6 Iowa when he came up with five tackles, 3.0 for loss, 2.0 sacks and blocked a kick.
- Replogle is Purdue's first on the Lombardi Watch List since Kawann Short, now of the Carolina Panthers.
- Replogle was third on the team with eight tackles in the opener and hurried the pass that Gelen Robinson intercepted for a touchdown.

»CAPTAINS

- Darrell Hazell announced team captains at the team's annual kickoff luncheon Aug. 19.
- Hazell named seniors Jake Replogle, Jordan Roos and DeAngelo Yancey captains, as well as junior Ja'Whaun Bentley.
- Bentley is a captain for the second year in a row.
- Captains were voted on by the team. The vote was for upperclassmen, though one slot was opened for a possible write-in.

»INSTANT IMPACT

- Purdue has played 19 freshmen, including eight true freshmen, and four first-year junior college transfers this season.
- Freshmen have accounted for 35 points, 129 rushing yards, six passing yards, 130 receiving yards, an interception, 39 tackles and a PBU this season.

- Freshman kicker J.D. Dellinger is 11-for-11 on his extra points and 2-for-4 on field goals.

»WELCOME MIKE BOBINSKI

- Mike Bobinski was announced as Purdue University's new athletics director Aug. 9, 2016.
- Bobinski's first official day as the athletics director was Sept. 1.
- Bobinski is the ninth full-time athletics director in Purdue history.
- He comes to Purdue from Georgia Tech, where he had been since 2013. He had previously served as AD at Xavier (1998-2004, 2006-2013) and Akron (1994-1998).
- Bobinski is just the fourth full-time athletics director at Purdue in the last 74 years.
- Morgan J. Burke steps aside after serving as Purdue's athletics director since 1993. He will officially retire June 30, 2017, after serving a transitional role.
- Darrell Hazell gave Bobinski the game ball after the Boilermakers defeated Eastern Kentucky on Sept. 3.

»MALONE IN THE COMMUNITY

- Offensive coordinator Terry Malone, in his second year at Purdue and first calling plays, never shies away from extending a helping hand.
- On Aug. 24, nine tornadoes touched down across Indiana, the worst an EF-3 with a peak wind at 152 miles per hour in Kokomo, located about 45 miles east of West Lafayette.
- While fortunately no lives were lost, more than 1,000 structures were damaged, including 200 deemed a total loss. More than 15,000 people were without power and more than 200 needed at least temporary shelter.
- Though just one week before the season-opener, Malone and his wife, Ann, cleared their Saturday, Aug. 27 schedule and drove over to help clean up.
- Malone said afterwards, "It was very satisfying. I'm not sure how much we did to help, because there's so much work to be done, but we cleared three or four yards of debris and cut a couple trees down. But we had a really good day."
- That was not the first time the Malones have stepped in after a disaster.
- Malone, who came to Purdue from the New Orleans Saints, opened his speech at the Purdue Football Preseason Banquet on Aug. 19, expected to be a quick overview of the offense, by asking the Boilermaker community for





any help for his friends and neighbors back in Louisiana who are dealing with the tragic flooding.

- Malone was also helping in New Orleans after Hurricane Katrina, as he took the job in February 2006.
- Malone said Tuesday, "There was never a year in New Orleans without having something. So, it becomes a part of the way you think. The fact is that you really don't need to do a whole lot to help people who are in need. They really appreciate it and you get a lot more satisfaction of doing it than they probably do out of you helping them."

»**BOILERMAKERS IN THE COMMUNITY**

- The Purdue football program is incredibly involved with community service initiatives, as players and coaches regularly volunteer their time.
- The Boilermakers amassed more than 500 hours of community service from January to August of 2016 and have made more than 500 appearances at events and outings over the past five years.
- They have been involved with mission trips to Haiti and South Africa, pioneered community projects like Dream Season and IMPACT, and are regular visitors to local elementary schools.
- In addition to campus programs like the Purdue Dance Marathon for Riley Children's Hospital and the Purdue University Center for Cancer Research 5K run/walk, the football program has participated in the Indiana Blood Center blood drive each of the last 18 years.

»**THE LINEBACKERS**

- Purdue returns four linebackers who have each started at least nine games in their careers prior to this season.
- Those four linebackers, Danny Ezechukwu, Andy James Garcia, Ja'Whaun Bentley and Jimmy Herman, came up with a combined 232 tackles, 19.5 for loss, 2.5 sacks, two forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries, an interception and a touchdown last year.

»**Ja'Whaun Bentley (Jr.)**

- Bentley was voted a team captain Aug. 19.
- The rest of his accolades are on page 5.

»**Danny Ezechukwu (Jr.)**

- Ezechukwu started all 12 games last year.
- The Academic All-Big Ten selection finished second on the team with 79 total tackles, 40 solo, with two tackles

for loss, a sack, an interception, a fumble forced, a fumble recovered for a touchdown and two PBUs.

- Ezechukwu scooped a fumble against Virginia Tech at Purdue's 10-yard line and raced 90 yards down the left sideline for a score.
- Ezechukwu has 20 career starts.
- In the opener, Ezechukwu tied for the team lead with eight tackles.

»**Jimmy Herman (Sr.)**

- Herman appeared in eight games last year, including seven starts, while battling injury.
- He finished the season with 41 tackles, 6.0 for loss, half a sack and a forced fumble.
- Herman is a three-time Academic All-Big Ten selection.
- Herman has 15 starts in his career.
- He had three tackles against EKU and missed the Cincinnati game with an injury.

»**Andy James Garcia (Sr.)**

- Garcia appeared in all 12 games last year, including nine starts.
- He finished the year third on the team with 63 tackles, four for loss, a sack, a fumble recovered and three PBUs.
- Garcia has nine career starts.

»**Garrett Hudson (Jr.)**

- Hudson was another player who started among the linebackers.
- He appeared in nine games last season, including three starts.
- Hudson finished the year with 32 tackles, three for loss, half a sack and a fumble recovery.
- Hudson's fumble recovery came against Nebraska when he returned it 27 yards inside the Nebraska 20-yard line.

»**Markus Bailey (R-Fr.)**

- Bailey is one of a few redshirt freshmen with game experience.
- Bailey, who looks to play a significant role in this year's defense, appeared in the first three games last season before a knee injury sidelined him for the season.
- Bailey totaled 12 tackles, including nine solo, before the injury.
- He made his first career start vs. EKU and finished with four tackles.
- Bailey started against Cincinnati and led the team with nine tackles, including a career-high seven solo stops.
- He has 16 tackles this season.

»**THE TRAIN IS COMING HERE**

- Head coach Darrell Hazell saw a billboard on north I-65 towards campus that read, "The Train Is Coming."
- "The first year I saw it I said, 'It's OK.' The second and third year I said, 'You know what, it's starting to bother me a little bit.' In the back of my mind, I thought: 'At some point in time the train has to get here. It has to arrive.' "That sign is no longer there."-Hazell
- What is Hazell referring to? It's time to finish every game.
- The Boilermakers are a lot closer than it may seem, evident by the program's 1-7 record in one-possession games in the last three years, including 0-3 last year.
- Purdue was within a possession in the final quarter in five games last season:

»at Marshall - led with three minutes to go.

»vs. Bowling Green - had the ball at BG15 in tie game with three minutes to go.

»at Michigan State - had the ball across midfield down three with 1:30 to go.

»at Northwestern - game was tied with five minutes remaining.

»vs. Indiana - Purdue was within eight with 11 minutes left in the game.

- Those games didn't go Purdue's way, but now, with so much experience returning on both sides of the ball, "the train has to get here. It has to arrive."

- Purdue may have shown a glimpse of that against Nevada, coming back from a 14-3 deficit to win, including pitching a shutout in the second half.

»**Breaking Down The Production**

- Purdue scored 301 points last season, including 248 by position players (non-kickers). Of those 248, 186 points return (75 percent). The breakdown of last year's scoring by current class:

»**BURGESS' BASEBALL BACKGROUND**

- Purdue sophomore receiver Jarrett Burgess turned 26 on Aug. 25.
- Burgess played five seasons of minor league baseball after being selected in the sixth round of the 2008 Major





League Baseball draft by the Seattle Mariners.

- Burgess played outfield and pitched, throwing 97 miles per hour off the mound, during his career in rookie and Class A ball.
- Burgess came to Purdue last summer after not playing organized football for more than 10 years, as he did not play in high school.
- Burgess comes from a football-heavy family, as his dad, Fernanza, was a wide receiver for the New York Jets and Miami Dolphins, and his uncle James Burgess, played two seasons as a linebacker for the San Diego Chargers. Jarrett's cousin, James Jr., wrapped up his senior season as a linebacker at Louisville last fall.
- Last season, Burgess had 60 rushing yards and a touchdown on three carries, as well as 20 receiving yards.
- He made his first career catch against Eastern Kentucky in this year's opener.
- Burgess suffered a hand injury in practice before the Nevada game and will miss a couple weeks.

»CURIOUS CASE OF THIRD DOWNS

- Third-down success on offense and defense can often predict the outcomes of games.
- Purdue's offense ranks second in the country in third-down conversions with a success rate of 59.2 percent.
- The defense, however, is on the other end of the spectrum, yielding first downs on 57.1 percent of occasions. That ranks 128th.
- Purdue has seen much better defensive third-down success in second halves this season, limiting Eastern Kentucky to 0 for 7 in the final 30 minutes. Cincinnati was just 4 for 10 on third down in the second half against Purdue and Nevada picked up 3 of 7 in the second half.
- Purdue's defense has given up first downs on 25 of 32 occasions in first halves this season (.781), while allowing just 7 of 24 in the second halves (.292).

»WATCH LISTS

- Purdue has two players on a total of four watch lists to start the season.

»Markell Jones

- Jones was named to the Doak Walked Award watch list.
- The award goes to the nation's premier running back for his accomplishments on the field, achievement in the classroom and citizenship in the community.

»Jake Replogle

- Replogle has racked up the watch lists, as the senior defensive tackle is on three.
- Replogle most recently was named to the Rotary Lombardi Award watch list.
- That award goes recognizes the most outstanding college football lineman.
- Replogle is also on the Outland Trophy watch list.
- The Outland Trophy is presented to the nation's top interior offensive or defensive lineman.
- Replogle is also on the Chuck Bednarik Award watch list.
- The award goes to the nation's defensive player of the year.

»50-YEAR SALUTE

- The Boilermakers remember the 1966 season's Rose Bowl champions 50 years later.
- This season's game dates line up with those of the 1966 season.
- This week 50 years ago, the Boilermakers were coming off a 26-14 loss at eventual national champion Notre Dame.
- The Boilermakers bounced back with a 35-23 home win over SMU to improve to 2-1 on the season.

»BOILER BRIDGE WALK

- The popular Boiler Bridge Walk takes place every Friday before a home game.
- Join the Boilermakers as they cross the John T. Myers Pedestrian Bridge connecting West Lafayette and Lafayette.
- The free event also features live music, giveaways and appearances by the cheerleaders and Purdue Pete beginning at 5:45 p.m.
- The team arrives at approximately 6 o'clock near the Sonya L. Margerum Fountain on the West Lafayette side of the bridge and walks to Riehle Plaza, interacting with fans along the way.

»FOOTBALL PERFORMANCE COMPLEX

- The Boilermakers are building a new football performance complex, a \$65 million project, on the north end of the Mollenkopf Athletic Center.
- The complex is part of the Football Master Plan, which consists of six points: coaching and support staff, player development, academic support, recruiting, fan engagement, and contemporary facilities.
- The project is expected to be completed in August 2017.
- The three-level structure – totaling 110,000 square feet – will include a locker room, team meeting room,

position group meeting rooms, player development room, sports performance training area (weight room), sports medicine facility, nutrition station and coaches' offices, as well as a grand entrance lobby, which will highlight the Boilermakers' history and tradition.

»The Latest

- The foundation has been laid at the Football Performance Complex from the northwest to the east and south.
- Specifically, some 4,240 cubic yards of cast-in-place concrete were poured for the 110,000-square foot facility.
- Since work began, 23,375 cubic yards of mass excavation has occurred, and 401 aggregate piers and 92 augercast piles have been installed to support the foundation.
- All underground piping has been laid, including 2,697 feet of storm piping and 1,569 feet of water lines.
- Visibly, the building's two elevator shafts are in place, as are the hydrotherapy pool pits.
- Steel assembly is underway. When all is said and done, some 881 tons of structural steel and fabrication will be in place.

»NEW ASSISTANT COACHES

- The Boilermakers have five new assistant coaches, which is tied for the fifth-most of any team with the same head coach in FBS this year.

»Ross Els - Defensive Coordinator/Safeties

- Els was hired Jan. 1, 2016.
- Els returned to collegiate coaching after spending the 2015 season as an assistant coach at Lincoln Southwest, his son's high school in Lincoln, Nebraska.
- A veteran of 26 seasons of coaching on the collegiate level, Els most recently spent four seasons (2011-14) as linebackers coach and recruiting coordinator at Nebraska.
- Els has given the defense a spark, noticeably in second-half adjustments.
- After giving up nearly 300 yards of offense to Eastern Kentucky in the first half, Purdue limited the Colonels to just over 100 in the second half.
- Against Nevada, the Boilermakers shut out the Wolf Pack in the second half, something that hadn't been done by a Purdue team since 2012.

»Darrell Funk - Offensive Line

- Funk was hired Feb. 4, 2016.
- Funk, who boasts 29 years of collegiate coaching experience, came to the Boilermakers from Akron, where he





coached in 2015.

- Prior to Akron, Funk spent four seasons as the offensive line coach at Michigan (2011-14).
- Funk's offensive line has yielded just one sack this season, while helping the rushing game average 4.9 yards per carry.

»Tim Lester - Quarterbacks

- Lester was hired Dec. 28, 2015.
- Lester came to the Boilermakers from Syracuse, where he served as quarterbacks coach from 2013 to 2015 and as offensive coordinator the last two seasons, as well.
- Lester's work with David Blough has produced multiple 300-yard passing games already this season and an air attack that ranks 21st in the country.

»Randy Melvin - Defensive Line

- Melvin was hired Dec. 31, 2015.
- Melvin returned to the Boilermakers from Miami (Fla.).
- He previously coached at Purdue as defensive ends coach from 1997 to 1999 and worked as an assistant with Purdue head coach Darrell Hazell at Eastern Illinois in 1988 under head coach Bob Spoo and again at Rutgers in 2002 under head coach Greg Schiano.
- He was at Miami for one year.
- Prior to Miami, he was at Florida International for a year.
- He was the defensive line coach with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers in 2012 and 2013.
- In 2001, he was the defensive line coach with the New England Patriots when they won Super Bowl XXXVI.
- Melvin's defensive line had a big day against Nevada, stifling its potent rushing attack to just 68 yards on the ground. His group had 5.0 sacks in the game and 7.5 tackles for loss.

»DeAndre Smith - Running Backs

- Smith was hired Jan. 26, 2016.
- Smith came to the Boilermakers from Syracuse, where he spent the previous three seasons in a similar role.
- Smith previously coached running backs at New Mexico (2012, 2008), Illinois (2010-11), UNLV (2009), Miami (Ohio) (2005-07) and Northern Illinois (2001-04).
- Smith has helped Purdue's rushing attack return to form, averaging 176.7 yards and two touchdowns on the ground per game.

»Terry Malone

- Malone is a second-year coach, but enters his first season as the team's

offensive coordinator.

- He was promoted Dec. 22, 2015.
- In his first game as offensive coordinator, the Boilermakers scored touchdowns on their first two drives. It was the first time since 2009 that Purdue scored on its opening drive of the season.
- Malone has rejuvenated the Purdue offense and already has a pair of 500-yard outings, as well as at least 450-yards in all three games.
- Malone's offense ranks 26th in the country, and he has helped Purdue convert 59.2 percent of third downs, which is second-best in the nation.

"Everyone will accomplish this through tireless work, an intellectual approach, extraordinary execution and the relentless pursuit of excellence. It is our obligation to the organization that we reach the level we are capable."
- Players with a cumulative grade-point average of 3.0 or better get their pictures on the "A Players Wall," located in the football office complex in the Mollenkopf Athletic Center.
- Currently, 46 players are featured on the wall.
- Through the spring 2016 semester, the Boilermakers achieved a composite GPA of 2.89, the highest mark on record (since 2001), and the team received the athletics department Provost Award for having the most improved GPA from the fall to spring semester.
- Furthermore, Hazell issues each of his players, coaches and support staff members an "A Player's Manual."
- This year's binder is filled with 760 pages of information and tactics on how to become a better player, student and person.
