PURDUE SCOUTING REPORT

OFFENSE

First-year head coach Jeff Brohm arrived at Purdue heralded for his offensive acumen, and his ingenuity enabled Purdue to find success both running and throwing the football. The Boilermakers averaged 390.4 yards of total offense (239.5



passing and 150.9 rushing) and 24.2 points per game.
Junior David Blough and sophomore Elijah Sindelar split time at qWuarterback before Blough suffered a season-ending injury in early November. Sindelar, who is one of just two Football Bowl Subdivision starting signal-callers majoring in engineering, wound up completing 55.8 percent of his passes for 1,703 yards with 14 touchdowns and merely six interceptions.

Eleven players accumulated double-digit reception totals, led by redshirt freshman Jackson Anthrop (44 catches, 391 yards and five touchdowns) and senior Anthony Mahoungou (34 catches, 570 yards and six touchdowns). In the Boilermakers' had-to-have-it 24-15 victory at lowa on Nov. 18, Mahoungou had a careerbest game with seven receptions for 135 yards and two touchdowns. Five of the catches for 118 yards and both scores came in a span of six plays on the first two possessions of the third quarter, turning a 9-7 deficit into a 21-9 advantage in a matter of three minutes.

Junior tight end Cole Herdman caught at least one pass in every game for the second straight season, extending his streak to 28 consecutive contests.

Four running backs buoyed the rushing attack: junior Markell Jones (480 yards, 5.2 average), junior D.J. Knox (460 yards, 5.8 average), sophomore Tario Fuller (261 yards, 6.1 average) and sophomore Richie Worship (257 yards, 4.8 average). Jones erupted for a career-best 217 yards – the seventh-most in school history – in the season finale, a 31-24 bowl-clinching win in the annual Old Oaken Bucket game against Indiana.

Junior Kirk Barron, who has started the last 25 games at center, anchored the offensive line, which benefitted from the addition of two transfers – fifth-year senior right tackle David Steinmetz and junior left guard Shane Evans.

Purdue scored on its opening drive five times and won all five games.

DEFENSE

Under new co-coordinators Nick Holt and Anthony Poindexter, the Boilermakers boasted the mostimproved defense in the country. In 2016, Purdue allowed a school-record average of 38.2 points per game.

That figure essentially was sliced in half this season at 19.3 points per game. In Big Ten Conference games, the makeover was even more incredible: 42.6 to 19.2 points per game (+23.4). The Boilermakers allowed two touchdowns or fewer in eight games, and they gave up only two second-half touchdowns in five road games.

The major reason for the upgrade was rushing defense as Purdue went from allowing 238.4 to 133.3 yards per game, the third-best turnaround nationally.

Seven senior starters were keys to the about-face: tackle Gelen Robinson, ends Danny Ezechukwu and Austin Larkin, linebackers Ja'Whaun Bentley and T.J. McCollum, and cornerbacks Da'Wan Hunte and Josh Okonye. McCollum and Okonye were graduate transfers. Robinson earned third team All-Big Ten honors after pacing Purdue with 11.5 tackles for loss. Ezechukwu recovered three fumbles (tied for the fourth-most in the country). Bentley led the way with 89 tackles and returned an interception 76 yards for a touchdown to seal the Boilermakers' 31-14 win over Minnesota on Oct. 7. Okonye and Hunte recorded nine and seven pass breakups, respectively.

Sophomore linebacker Markus Bailey put together an outstanding all-around season to the tune of 78 tackles, including 10 for loss and seven sacks, with two pass breakups, one interception, one fumble forced and one fumble recovered.

Another sophomore, safety Navon Mosley, topped the team with two interceptions.

Opponents had 13 fumbles against the Boilermakers, who recovered 10 of them, including six in Purdue territory – four inside the 10-yard line and three inside the 5-yard line.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Purdue had three constants on special teams: made field goals, touchbacks and trick plays.

Junior Spencer Evans, another transfer, and sophomore J.D. Dellinger were perfect on field goal attempts of 40 yards or less, going 16 for 16 combined.

Of Evans' 66 kickoffs, 34 were touchbacks (51.5 percent). Last season, Purdue had just seven touchbacks.

And special teams coordinator Tony Levine dialed up four fake punts, all resulting in first downs. None was bigger than junior punter Joe Schopper's 22-yard pass to sophomore Mike Little in the second quarter against Indiana. It came on fourth-and-3 from the Hoosiers' 43-yard line and led to a touchdown that gave the Boilermakers a 14-7 advantage they would not relinquish.

Schopper averaged 40.2 yards per punt. Of his 67 attempts, 38 were fair caught, 28 came to rest inside the opponent's 20-yard line and 15 traveled 50 or more yards.

Senior linebacker Garrett Hudson, whose interception led to Purdue's first touchdown against Indiana, blocked two punts on the season to tie the school record.

Brohm's Playing Career

- He was a three-year starter at Louisville, playing for the Cardinals from 1989 to 1993.
- He still ranks sixth in program history in touchdown passes (38), seventh in total offense (5,410), eighth in completion percentage (.562), eighth in passing yards (5,451), eighth in passing efficiency (129.97), ninth in passing attempts (715) and ninth in completions (402)
- Brohm was voted the team's Most Valuable Player as a junior and senior, and his number 11 became part of Louisville's Ring of Honor in 2006.
- Brohm still has the 11th longest touchdown pass in school with an 80-yard strike to Ralph Dawkins vs. Texas in 1993.
- Brohm threw 20 touchdown passes in 1993, which is tied for 10th most in a single season.

- Jeff Brohm was the quarterbacks coach and interim offensive coordinator for the Illinois Fighting Illini at this bowl in 2011. Then, it was named the Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl. Brohm's offense put up 20 points, including 17 in the second half, to knock off UCLA 20-14.
- Brohm was a quarterback for the San Francisco 49ers from 1997 to 1998. He played in eight games and completed 37 of 58 passes for 353 yards, a touchdown and an interception.
- In 2010, Brohm was the quarterbacks coach at Illinois and faced Rich Rodriguez's Michigan team in Ann Arbor. Brohm's quarterbacks led the offense to 65 points, but the Wolverins pulled it out in three overtimes, 67-65. That is the most points ever allowed in a game by a Michigan team
- While Brohm was at Louisville, the Cardinals played Rodriguez's West Virginia Mountaineers three times. In 2005 and 2006 with Brohm as quarterbacks coach, the Cardinals put up 44 points in both meetings, losing the 2005 game in three overtimes 46-44, before winning the 2006 game 44-34. In 2007, Brohm was the assistant head coach and passing game coordinator and the Cardinals fell at West Virginia 38-31.
- The Foster Farms Bowl will be Brohm's first game against a Pac-12 foe as a head coach.





- Sindelar's starts are vs. Louisville, Ohio, at Wisconsin, at Rutgers, at Northwestern, at Iowa and Indiana.
- Sindelar is majoring in electrical engineering with an emphasis in power and energy.
- Only one other starting quarterback in the country is an engineering major - Louisiana true freshman Levi Lewis. Lewis, a civil engineer, has started three games this season for the Ragin' Cajuns.
- Since stepping in after Blough's injury against Illinois, Sindelar has completed 76 of 128 passes (.594) for 796 yards, eight touchdowns and one interception. Including the Illinois game, the Boilermakers won three of those four games.
- Over the last four games, Sindelar completed 20 of 30 pass attempts (.667) for 205 yards, three touchdowns and an interception in fourth quarters.

- Completed 37 of 60 passes for 376 yards, two touchdowns and an interception. His completions, attempts and yards are career highs.
- His 37 completions are the most passes by a Purdue quarterback since Joey Elliott completed 39 against Michigan State on Nov. 14, 2009.
- His 37 completions are tied for the 10th most in a single game in school history.
- His 60 pass attempts are tied for the sixth most in a single game in program history. He is the first to throw at least 60 passes in a game since Curtis Painter threw the ball 60 times against Ohio State on Oct. 6, 2007. The last quarterback to have more passing attempts in a game was Kyle Orton against Washington State on Dec. 31, 2001 when he threw the ball 74 times.
- His 376 yards are the most by a Purdue quarterback since Blough threw for 391 at Minnesota on Nov. 5, 2016.
- He became the 22nd quarterback in school history with at least one 300-yard passing game.
- His passing total is the 30th best in a single game in school history.
- Only nine quarterbacks in school history have thrown for more yards in a game: Drew Brees (nine times), Curtis Painter (five times), Kyle Orton (four times), Jim Everett (three times), Blough (three times), Scott Campbell (twice), Danny Etling (once), Mark Herrmann (once) and Mike Phipps (once).

»Sindelar at Iowa

- Sixth career start.
- Completed 22 of 37 passes for 229 yards and three touchdowns, a career high.
- Picked up his first road win as a starter.
- Completed his first five passes of the second half for 118 yards and two touchdowns. Just 3:01 of clock elapsed, including an lowa drive.

»Sindelar vs. Indiana

- Seventh career start.
- Completed 15 of 29 passes for 159 yards and two touchdowns.
- Gave Purdue a commanding 31-10 lead with a 4-yard touchdown pass to Isaac Zico with 12:32 remaining in the game. It was his final pass attempt of the game.

- Boone was the defensive coordinator and linebackers coach at William & Mary in 2012 and 2013 when Purdue running backs coach Chris Barclay was the running backs coach for the Tribe.

SPARKING THE OFFENSE

- Redshirt freshman quarterback/receiver Jared Sparks is the team's No. 2 quarterback and a starting wide receiver.
- He is the only No. 2 quarterback in the country that is a regular contributor at another position. No other No. 2 QB in the country has started a game at another position this season.
- At Northwestern, in his first true game as the team's No. 2 quarterback, Sparks hauled in a career-high 11 catches for a career-high 130 vards
- He is Purdue's first 100-yard receiver since DeAngelo Yancey had 155 receiving yards against Wisconsin on Nov. 19, 2016.
- He is Purdue's first freshman with 100 yards receiving in a game since Yancey had 125 receiving yards on 11 catches Nov. 30, 2013 at Indiana.
- His receiving-yard total is the most by a freshman since Yancey had 146 against Nebraska on Oct. 12, 2013.
- He is the first No. 2 quarterback in the country to have a 100-yard receiving game since TCU's Trevone Boykin had exactly 100 receiving yards against West Virginia on Nov. 2, 2013.
- Sparks is the 73rd Boilermaker in program history with at least one 100-yard receiving game.
- Prior to Sparks' 11 receptions at Northwestern, the most receptions by a Boilermaker in a game this season was seven.

MAHOUNGOU'S TAKEOVER

- Senior wide receiver Anthony Mahoungou
 has been dominant the last nine quarters of the
 regular season, starting with the fourth quarter at
 Northwestern.
- In the fourth quarter at Northwestern, he had three catches for 25 yards and a touchdown to keep the Boilermakers in the game.
- At lowa, he had five catches for 118 yards and two touchdowns on back-to-back drives to start the half. Three different defensive backs attempted to cover him during the two drives.
- He finished the game with seven catches for 135 yards and the two scores. His receiving yards and touchdown catches are career highs, while the seven receptions tie his career high.
- Mahoungou is the 74th Boilermaker in school history with a 100-yard receiving game.
- Against Indiana, he had two catches for 88 yards, including a 49-yard touchdown grab to give Purdue a 21-10 lead in the second quarter.
- Mahoungou was named the Big Ten's co-Offensive Player of the Week for his effort at lowa. He was Purdue's first B1G offensive player of the week since David Blough on Nov. 2, 2015 and the Boilermakers' first wide receiver to earn a weekly award since Dorien Bryant was co-Offensive Player of the Week on Oct. 22, 2007.
- Mahoungou has a touchdown catch in three straight games, the first Boilermaker to do so since DeAngelo Yancey had one in four straight games last season.

BURGESS' TIME TO SHINE

- Junior wide receiver Jarrett Burgess has been waiting longer than most, if not all, college football players for his moment to shine on the gridiron.
- Burgess turned 27 years old on Aug. 10.
- He played five seasons of minor league baseball after being selected in the sixth round of the 2008 Major League Baseball draft by the Seattle Mariners.

- Burgess played outfield and pitched, throwing 97 miles per hour on the mound, during his career in rookie and Class A ball.
- Burgess came to Purdue in 2015 after not playing organized football in more than a decade, as he did not play in high school.
- Burgess comes from a football-heavy family, as his dad, Fernanza, was a wide receiver for the New York Jets and Miami Dolphins, and his uncle James Burgess played two seasons as a linebacker for the San Diego Chargers.
- Jarrett's cousin, James Jr., played linebacker at Louisville and graduated in 2015.
- Burgess hauled in his first career touchdown reception at Northwestern, a 21-yard catch.
- For the season, he has 11 catches for 130 yards and the score, after missing most of the season coming back from injury. His 11 catches were in Purdue's three game spa from Illinois to Iowa.

JONESING FOR A BIG GROUND GAME

- Junior running back **Markell Jones** had a historic day carrying the football against Indiana. He had 31 carries for 217 yards (7.0 avg.).
- His performance was:
 - "The third-most rushing yards by a Purdue running back in the Purdue-Indiana rivalry
 "The fifth-best individual rushing effort against a Big Ten foe in school history





BLOCKING PUNTS

- Purdue, more specifically **Garrett Hudson**, has blocked two punts this season.
- The team blocked punt total is tied for ninth in the country.
- The national lead is five by Virginia Tech and Arizona State.
- Hudson tied Purdue's single season record with the two blocked punts.

• Nationally, Hudson is one of 26 players with two blocked kicks of any kind. Justin Lawler of SMU and Jeffery Simmons of Mississippi State lead the way with three each.

ROAD SECOND HALVES

- Purdue allowed just 22 points in road second halves this season - an average of 4.4 points allowed per road second half.
- Purdue allowed just two second half touchdowns on the road this season after allowing two or more in four of last season's five road games and 11 total.
- The defense did not allow a point in a road second half until Rutgers' second possession of the third quarter, when the Scarlet Knights scored a touchdown.
- The Boilermakers shut out Missouri on the road in week three in the second half.
- At No. 7 Wisconsin, the Boilermakers kept the Badgers off the board in the final 30 minutes.
- At Northwestern, Purdue kept the Wildcats out of the end zone in the second half, but did allow three field goals.
- At lowa, Purdue held the Hawkeyes scoreless in the second half until 1:04 left in the game when they scored a touchdown.
- In road second halves, Purdue has six takeaways, with four interceptions and two fumble recoveries, while allowing just five scores, with three field goals and two touchdowns.

DEFENSE TOUGH ON THE ROAD

- The Boilermakers played five road games this season - at Missouri, at No. 7 Wisconsin, at Rutgers, at Northwestern and at lowa.
- In those games, the Boilermakers allowed just 14.4 points per game, including just 22 total points in second halves.
- The Boilermakers have eight takeaways in road games with four interceptions and four fumble recoveries.
- In road games, the Boilermakers forced 36 punts this season an average of 7.2 per game.
- The Boilermaker defense allowed just eight touchdowns on the road this season and three were in first quarters.
- Purdue's defense allowed just 81 first downs on the road this season, an average of 16.2 per game.

- Senior defensive end **Danny Ezechukwu** has three fumble recoveries this season. That is tied for fourth in the nation.
- Ezechukwu has fumble recoveries against Louisville, Ohio and Michigan.
- The Purdue record for fumble recoveries in a season is four by Jim Wood (1974), Freddie Arrington (1977), Mike Marks (1980), Niko Koutouvides (2001), Shaun Phillips (2001) and Brandon Erwin (2006).
- Ezechukwu has four career fumble recoveries, which is three shy of Purdue's career record.

POWER FIVE PACKED SCHEDULE

- With Louisville and Missouri on Purdue's nonconference schedule, the Boilermakers faced 11 teams from Power Five conferences in the regular season, while Arizona will be the 12th.
- The Boilermakers were the only team in the Big Ten with at least 11 opponents from Power Five conferences in the regular season.
- Only three other teams in the country faced 11 Power Five (including Notre Dame) programs during the regular season.
- Texas faced the full Big 12 slate, as well as Maryland and USC. Cal's schedule featured nine Pac-12 opponents as well as North Carolina and Ole Miss. USC's schedule featured nine Pac-12 opponents as well as Texas and Notre Dame.
- Nine of Purdue's regular season opponents played in bowls last year, tied for sixth most in FBS.

»Highly-Ranked Foes, Too

- The Boilermakers faced three top-16 teams through the first six games of the season, including two in the top eight.
- The Boilermakers are one of three teams in the country who faced three top-16 foes through the first six games (also Clemson & Mississippi State).
- Purdue's opponents were ranked No. 16, No. 8 and No. 7. Brohm is the only head coach in his first year at the new institution in that group.
- Northwestern, while not ranked in the AP poll, was ranked 25th in the College Football Playoff poll when the Boilermakers travelled to Evanston.
- The Wildcats rank 20th in the latest poll.
- While the Hawkeyes were not ranked for the matchup, Iowa was ranked as high as 20th in the College Football Playoff poll two weeks prior. The Hawkeyes also peaked at 25th in the AP poll.
- Arizona was ranked as high as 22nd in the initial College Football Playoff ranks and 23rd in the Week 10 AP Poll.

THE CAPTAINS

- The Boilermakers voted on captains in the team's first meeting of fall camp. Six individuals were chosen with three on offense and three on
- The offensive captains are junior center **Kirk** Barron, junior quarterback David Blough and senior wide receiver Gregory Phillips.
- The defensive captains are senior linebacker Ja'Whaun Bentley, senior linebacker Danny Ezechukwu and senior cornerback Da'Wan
- Barron, Blough, Ezechukwu, Hunte are Phillips were selected for the first time in their career.
- Bentley has been voted a captain three years in a row. He is the first three-time captain in program history.

THREE-TIME CAPTAINS

- Bentley is Purdue's first three-time captain in school history. The feat is not only rare to Purdue, it is scarce in college football.
- Just six current athletes in FBS are a three-time captain, including Bentley.

TOTAL DEFENSE UNDER 220 YARDS

- The Purdue defense held Missouri to 203 yards and Rutgers to 217 yards, both on the road.
- The last time the Boilermakers held a team under 220 yards of total offense prior to this season was Sept. 1, 2012 when Purdue limited FCS Eastern Kentucky to 190 total yards.
- In 2011, Purdue held Southeast Missouri to 153 yards and Minnesota to 213 yards. That's the last time the Boilermakers held two opponents in a season under 220 yards.
- •The last time Purdue held two FBS opponents under 220 yards of total offense was 2004 when the Boilermakers held Syracuse and Ball State each to 197 yards in back-to-back weeks to open the season
- The last time Purdue held multiple Power Five conference teams to less than 220 total yards of offense in a season was 2003. That year, Arizona gained just 174 yards, Illinois was held to 191 yards and Penn State had just 204 yards of total offense.
- Prior to this season, the last time Purdue held an opponent under 220 yards in a road game was 2002 at Notre Dame when the Fighting Irish gained just 203 yards.

- In Purdue's game against Illinois, the Boilermakers held the Fighting Illini to 250 total yards of offense.
- The last time a Purdue team held three opponents to 250 total yards or less in a season was 2003 when the Boilermakers did so against four teams. That year, Purdue held Wake Forest to 244, Arizona to 174, Illinois to 191 and Penn State to 204.
- Purdue's defensive performance at lowa nearly made the cut, as the Boilermakers allowed only 258 yards of total offense.

EARLY LEADS

- Purdue scored first in seven games, including the first three games this season.
- The Boilermakers had a half time lead in seven games this season, including the first four games of the year.
- Purdue had a lead in nine games this season. The only games the Boilermakers never led were at Wisconsin, at Rutgers and at Northwestern.



SEASON ODDS AND ENDS

- Ja'Whaun Bentley forced two fumbles in the season opener, one of just four players in the country to do so in week one.
- Transfer kicker **Spencer Evans** had seven touchbacks against Ohio matching Purdue's total for all of 2016. Evans has 34 touchbacks this year
- No returning FBS tight end had more touchdown catches last season than Brycen Hopkins, who had four. Hopkins has three this year.
- The Boilermakers had thrown at least one touchdown pass in 22 straight games before the streak was snapped at Wisconsin. The last time Purdue had not thrown one prior to that was Oct. 17, 2015, when the Boilermakers fell at Wisconsin 24-7
- Purdue had four turnovers against Minnesota and won. It's the first time with at least four turnovers in a conference win since 2000 vs. Ohio State.
- Purdue had not allowed a point in a second half on the road through the first two away games. Rutgers ended the streak with a touchdown in the third quarter, but the Boilermakers then shut out the Scarlet Knights in the fourth quarter.
- The last time Purdue had three AP top-16 opponents in its first six games of a season was 2008, Joe Tiller's final season. Purdue faced that
- Purdue also faced three top-16 teams in the opening six weeks seven other times.
- In 1953 and 1960, the Boilermakers faced four top-16 teams in the first six weeks.
- At Northwestern, Sindelar was 14-26 for 111 yards in the first half. In the second half, he was 23-34 for 265 yards, two touchdowns and an interception.

FOOTBALL PERFORMANCE COMPLEX

- The football performance complex, which is located adjacent to the north end of the Mollenkopf Athletic Center, was completed in August of 2017.
- The three-level structure amassing 112,000 square feet – includes a locker room, team meeting room, position group meeting rooms, player development room, weight room, sports medicine and hydrotherapy area, nutrition station, and coaches' and support staff offices, as well as a grand entrance lobby showcasing the Boilermakers' history and tradition.
- The state-of-the-art complex has significantly enhanced the football student-athlete experience In addition to the first-class amenities, having all of them located in one facility results in more efficient use of the student-athletes' time. Previously, football-related facilities were housed in multiple buildings.
- A \$65 million project, the football performance complex was designed by Populous, while construction was managed by the Hunt Construction Group. The groundbreaking ceremony took place April 15, 2016 - with 11 Purdue Super Bowl champions in attendance – and construction took 16 months. The facility was dedicated Sept. 8, 2017.

- Elijah Sindelar and David Blough both threw two touchdown passes against Louisville.
- The Boilermakers have not achieved that feat in a game since 1998 when the Boilermakers beat Indiana 52-7 in Ross-Ade Stadium.
- Drew Brees was 20 for 33 for 237 yards, four touchdowns and an interception before David Edgerton came in and completed 3 of 4 passes for 37 yards and two scores.
- Against Ohio, Sindelar had one touchdown pass, while Blough had three.
- At Missouri, Blough and Sindelar both threw for a touchdown.
- Purdue was the only team in the country to have a pair of QBs throw at least one touchdown pass in each of the first three games of the season.

MORE TD PASSES THAN INCOMPLETIONS

• David Blough was 11-13 for 235 yards and three touchdowns against Ohio.

- He is the first Purdue quarterback to throw more touchdown passes than incompletions in a game (minimum 10 attempts) since Kyle Orton went 23 for 26 for 329 yards and five touchdowns against Ball State on Sept. 11, 2004.
- Elijah Sindelar was 2-for-2 with a touchdown against Illinois, though he did not have enough attempts to qualify.

BLOUGH PERFORMANCE OVATION-WORTHY

- Junior quarterback David Blough has put up impressive numbers on the field, but his biggest ovation may have come at the Big Ten Football Media Luncheon in Chicago over the summer.

- In evening meetings, Blough and the other college quarterbacks were able to pick the Mannings' brains on everything from game preparation, film study, technique and more.



 Prior to this season, the last time Purdue's defense held an opponent to 17 or fewer points in three straight conference games, as Purdue did against Minnesota, Wisconsin and Rutgers this season, was 2003. That year, the Boilermakers held their last four opponents (Northwestern, No. 10 Iowa, at No. 4 Ohio State and at Indiana) all to 17 or less points.



HONORING BOB DEMOSS

- Throughout the 2017 season, the Boilermakers are honoring Bob DeMoss, the patriarch of the Cradle of Quarterbacks and a member of the Purdue Intercollegiate Athletics Hall of Game with a helmet sticker and a flag atop section 101 of Ross-Ade Stadium. DeMoss, a former Boilermaker quarterback and head coach, passed away July
- DeMoss initially gained fame as a freshman at Purdue in 1945. He helped the Boilermakers win their first four games and move into the national rankings at No. 9. Their next opponent was fourth-ranked Ohio State on Oct. 20 in Columbus. Purdue raced to a 28-0 lead and went on to an improbable 35-13 victory before 73,585 fans, the most ever to watch the Boilermakers at that time.
- DeMoss went on to be Purdue's primary quarterback through 1948, passing for 2,759 yards and 23 touchdowns during his career, and then played professionally with the New York Bulldogs in 1949.
- DeMoss subsequently embarked on a 42-year tenure at Purdue as an assistant coach (1950-69), head coach (1970-72) and assistant athletics director (1973-92). Along the way, he recruited and developed many members of the Cradle -Dale Samuels, Len Dawson, Bob Griese, Mike Phipps and Gary Danielson - earning fame as a "quarterback architect."
- DeMoss was the last quarterback to coach the Boilermaker until head coach Jeff Brohm.



JOE TILLER: 1942-2017

- Joe Tiller, one of the most beloved and popular figures in Purdue Athletics history, passed away Sept. 30 at the age of 74 in Buffalo, Wyoming.
- Tiller served as the Boilermakers' head football coach from 1997 to 2008. The winningest coach in school history, he posted an 87-62 record, including 53-43 in Big Ten Conference games. Tiller's 149 games coached are the most in Purdue annals.
- Prior to Tiller's hiring in November of 1996, Purdue football had played in a total of five bowl games. In the preceding 15 years, the Boilermakers managed merely a 54-107-5 record.
- Tiller introduced the spread offense to Purdue, featuring three, four, even five wide receivers and forcing defenses to cover the field from sideline to sideline. It was a radical change from the smash-mouth Big Ten style and, in the basketball-crazed state of Indiana, was dubbed affectionately "basketball on grass."
- The result was 10 bowl games, including the 2001 Rose Bowl, an average of more than seven wins per season and a Big Ten championship in 2000.
- Tiller coached 53 Purdue players who went on to the National Football League, six All-Americans and two Academic All-Americans.
- Tiller was recognized as the 1997 Big Ten and national Coach of the Year.
- In addition to the Rose Bowl, the Boilermakers played in the 1997 Alamo, 1998 Alamo, 2000 Outback, 2001 Sun, 2002 Sun, 2004 Capital One, 2004 Sun, 2006 Champs Sports and 2007 Motor City bowls

- Purdue was nationally ranked in the Associated Press poll for 80 weeks – tied for the most under any coach in school history – including a high of No. 5 during the 2004 season.
- Tiller topped Jack Mollenkopf for the most wins by a Purdue coach with his 85th victory - a 32-25 verdict over Central Michigan at Ross-Ade Stadium on Sept. 20, 2008.
- Tiller served as head coach of the East team in the 2015 East-West Shrine Game and earned a 45-27 victory. He played for the West team in 1963 and became just the fifth individual to both play and coach in the Shrine Game.
- From 1983 to 1986, Tiller was assistant head coach, defensive coordinator and defensive line coach at Purdue under Leon Burtnett.
- In January of 2008, Tiller was awarded the Order of the Griffin, one of Purdue's highest honors, given to individuals whose commitment to the university goes well beyond the call of duty, and whose strength and vision have greatly benefited the institution. He was appointed head coach emeritus by the board of trustees Nov. 21, 2008.
- Tiller was inducted into the Indiana Football Hall of Fame in 2012 and the Purdue Intercollegiate Athletics Hall of Fame in 2013. Joe Tiller Drive, located immediately north of Ross-Ade Stadium, was named in his honor in 2015.
- Tiller's 18-year head coaching record, including six seasons at Wyoming from 1991 to 1996, was 126-92-1, a .578 winning percentage.

MCCONNELL TO BROADCASTERS HALL OF FAME

- Joe McConnell, who served as the radio voice of Purdue football from 1994 to 2009, was inducted into the Indiana Broadcast Pioneers Hall of Fame on Nov. 3.
- McConnell enjoyed a long and distinguished career. Beyond Purdue, his experience included 23 seasons in the National Football League as the voice of the Denver Broncos (1969), Minnesota Vikings (1971-76 and 1985-87), Chicago Bears (1977-84), Indianapolis Colts (1992-94) and Tennessee Oilers (1997-98); seven seasons in the National Basketball Association as the voice of the Phoenix Suns (1970-72) and Indiana Pacers (1972-77); and seven seasons in Major League Baseball as the voice of the Minnesota Twins (1978-79) and Chicago White Sox (1980-84).
- McConnell also spent five seasons (1991-95) as lead voice for the NBA's National Game of the Week. He has broadcast three Super Bowls, the NBA and ABA championships, the NBA All-Star Game and the American League Championship Series.
- Additionally, McConnell broadcast Northwestern football (1988) and Indiana State (1978-79), DePaul (1984-88), Illinois (1987-88), Notre Dame (1987-88) and Northwestern men's basketball (1989-94)
- McConnell was honored with the AP/UPI Playby-Play Sportscaster of the Year Award five times and was the Indiana Sportscaster of the Year in 2000 and the Illinois Sportscaster of the Year in
- Upon his retirement as the voice of the Boilermakers, Purdue Athletics named the visiting team radio booth at Ross-Ade Stadium for McConnell.
- McConnell is a 1962 graduate of Franklin College. His broadcasting career began in 1962 at Purdue's campus radio station, WBAA. He served as assistant sports information director at Purdue from 1965 to 1967.



▶PURDUE-ARIZONA SERIES

Sept. 20, 2003 No. 25 Purdue 59, Arizona 7 West Lafayette, Indiana Ross-Ade Stadium (52,310)

The 25th-ranked Boilermakers wore black jerseys for the first time since 2001 and completely dominated Arizona 59-7 before a gathering of 52,310 at Ross-Ade Stadium.

The 59 points were the most ever scored at Ross-Ade and matched the most scored under head coach Joe Tiller, while the 52-point margin of victory was Purdue's largest since a 62-7 victory over Boston University at Fenway Park in 1947.

The Boilermakers amassed 580 yards total offense (tied for the third-most under Tiller and tied for the eighth-most ever) while limiting the Wildcats to just 174 (the second-best effort under Tiller). Purdue lit up the scoreboard for eight touchdowns and one field goal, and the nine scoring drives averaged merely 4.9 plays and 1:48 on the clock.

"Playing well was what we needed to do," head coach Joe Tiller. "We thought we made huge improvement from week one to week two. And I thought we played better this week."

Jerome Brooks and Jerod Void both rushed for two touchdowns, while Kyle Ingraham, Brandon Jones, John Standeford and Ray Williams each had a touchdown reception. Brooks ran for 122 yards on 21 carries to lead a ground attack that totaled 292 yards. Standeford caught four passes for 111 yards.

Kyle Orton completed 16 of 28 passes for 261 yards with three long touchdowns -- 81 yards to Standeford, 43 yards to Jones and 35 yards to Williams. Brandon Kirsch saw his first action of 2003 and rushed for 45 yards on just five carries and completed all three passes he attempted for 27 yards.

Purdue led 7-0 after the first guarter, 24-0 at halftime and 38-7 after three quarters.

Defensively, the Boilermakers forced four turnovers that led to 24 points. Landon Johnson tied the school record with two forced fumbles, recovered one of them, had an interception and made four tackles, including two for loss and one sack.

"It's always good whenever the offense takes over where you left off," Johnson said. "I'm sure it feels good for them, too."

Sept. 17, 2005 No. 12 Purdue 31, Arizona 24 Tucson, Arizona Arizona Stadium (56,400)

Behind a dominating effort in the trenches, the 12th-ranked Boilermakers defeated a pesky Arizona team 31-24 before a sellout crowd of 56,400 at Arizona Stadium on Sept. 17.

"I think our football team grew up some tonight," Purdue head coach Joe Tiller said. "I think this was a big game for Arizona. I think when your opponent really takes aim for you and you can answer the challenge time after time, then you begin to mature as a football team. It is a big win for us on the road against a good football team."

Purdue rolled up 239 yards rushing, while allowing the Wildcats merely nine yards via the ground, the seventh-best effort in school history and the best ever on the road.

"All of our backs did an exceptional job," Tiller said. "Defensively, we got a good push up the middle, and that allowed the outside guys to get to the quarterback."

Jerod Void led the offensive assault with 107 yards on 18 carries, a 5.9 average, and three touchdowns, including a career-long 66-yard burst that gave the Boilermakers a 7-0 lead. Brandon Kirsch rushed for 54 yards on eight carries (6.8 average), Kory Sheets 29 yards on 11 carries, Brandon Jones 27 yards on four carries (6.8 average) and Dorien Bryant 24 yards on two carries. Bryant also caught four passes for 82 yards, and all four receptions resulted in first downs.

Void recovered a fumble on an Arizona punt return that set up his third touchdown to put Purdue in front 28-17 late in the third quarter. The Wildcats had a chance in the game's final minute, but Brian Hickman came up with an interception at the Purdue 35-yard line with 38 seconds left to thwart the rally.

The Boilermakers recorded 11 tackles for loss, led by Ray Edwards with 2 1/2 and Stanford Keglar with two. Five players had one sack apiece. Keglar topped the team with seven total stops.

Ben Jones kicked his first field goal of the season, a 47-yarder.

The victory marked the Boilermakers' first at a Pac-10 stadium in 35 years and only their third ever. Their last such win was a 26-14 upset at No. 3 Stanford on Oct. 3, 1970.



First-year head coach Jeff Brohm was tasked with not only taking on preseason No. 16 Louisville and reigning Heisman Trophy winner Lamar Jackson, but also his alma mater in his Purdue coaching debut. The Boilermakers, who had won just nine games over the previous four seasons, held stout and led for much of the contest but a pair of late Cardinal scores tilted the balance in U of L's favor at Lucas Oil Stadium in Indianapolis. Splitting time at quarterback, Elijah Sindelar and David Blough combined to complete 33 of 47 passes for 293 yards and four touchdowns. Defensively, the Boilermakers thwarted a pair of Cardinal scoring opportunities with two fumbles forced inside the Purdue 5-yard line.

Heading on the road for the first time in 2017, the Boilermaker offense stunned Missouri with 370 yards of total offense and 28 points in the first half alone. In that same 30-minute span, Purdue's defense limited the Tiger offense to merely 91 total yards and three points. The Boilermakers tacked on a touchdown early in the third quarter to put the game away 35-3. Purdue's offense produced a balanced attack, with 272 yards passing and 205 yards rushing for 477 yards of total offense on the day. Purdue head coach Jeff Brohm spread the wealth offensively, with nine different players finishing with at least one rushing attempt and 13 different players catching at least one pass. Mizzou's 70 yards rushing accounted for the first of five games in which an opponent would be limited to 100 or less yards on the ground against the Boilermaker defense in 2017.

Purdue opened Big Ten play at home against No. 8 Michigan. The Boilermakers held tough early, and were leading 10-7 at halftime, but Michigan wore Purdue down in the second half and scored 21 unanswered points to win 28-10. McCollum led the defensive effort with nine total tackles apiece, while safety Navon Mosley intercepted his first pass of the year.

Purdue overcame a late Minnesota rally and Mother Nature to give head coach Jeff Brohm his first Big Ten victory. Trailing 14-13 with 9:58 remaining, J.D. Dellinger booted a 19-yard field goal to hand the lead back to the Boilermakers. Moments after Dellinger's kick cleared the uprights, both teams and fans had to evacuate the stadium due to thunderstorms. The game was delayed for 88 minutes, and when play resumed, Minnesota marched down the field on a 62-yard drive that took more than seven minutes off the clock to retake the lead 17-16 on a 38-yard field. On the ensuing kickoff, D.J. Knox set the Boilermakers up with fine field position on a 44-yard return. After running back Markell Jones was stopped for a 1-yard gain to open the ensuing Purdue drive, Elijah Sindelar hit Brycen Hopkins for six yards and Anthony Mahoungou for 37 more to move the ball to Minnesota's 12-yard line. Jones took it from there on the next play, racing the final distance into the end zone for the go-ahead touchdown with 1:17 left. Despite racking up nearly 500 yards of total offense, the Boilermakers struggled for a second consecutive week to put points on the scoreboard in a 14-12 loss at Rutgers. Even with the inability to find the end zone for most of the day, Purdue had an opportunity to tie the game after David Blough found Anthony Mahoungou on a 10-yard touchdown pass to cut Rutgers' lead to 14-12 with 25 seconds left. The ensuing two-point conversion attempt came up empty with the Scarlett Knights holding on for the narrow win. With 279 yards rushing and 195 yards passing, Purdue had little trouble moving the ball up and down the field all day, but all it amounted to was a pair of field goals and the late touchdown.
