## FIVE THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW

Minnesota returns home this weekend to play Purdue in its second-to-last home game of the season. The Gophers are 37-33-3 all-time against the Boilermakers and have won four of the last five meetings. Minnesota's four game-winning streak against Purdue came to an end last season when the Boilers prevailed 31-17 at home. However, Minnesota has not lost to Purdue at home (U is 31-12-3 all-time against Purdue at home) since 2007 and is a perfect 4-0 against the Boilers at TCF Bank Stadium (posting wins in 2009, 2012, 2014 and 2016).

Last:

Tanner Morgan replaced an injured Zack Annexstad to start the second half at Nebraska on Oct. 20 and played the entire game against Indiana and at Illinois. In the last 10 quarters, Morgan has completed 42-of-67 (63 percent) passes for 774 yards and five touchdowns. He threw for 302 yards against Indiana and then for 258 at Illinois making him the first Gopher quarterback since Mitch Leidner in 2015 to throw for 250 yards in consecutive games (Leidner tied Mike Hohensee's 1982 school record with four straight 250-yard games in 2015). Morgan's 86-yard touchdown to Rashod Bateman at Illinois was Minnesota's longest pass since Asad Abdul-Khaliq's school-record 96-yard touchdown to Jared Ellerson at Northwestern on Oct. 4, 2003.

Minnesota has 23 receptions of at least 25 yards and receivers Tyler Johnson (11), Rashod Bateman (7), Chris Autman-Bell (3) and Seth Green (1) all have at least one catch of more than 25 yards. Last year, Minnesota had 14

total receptions of 25 yards or more in 12 games. Minnesota had 18 receptions of 25 yards or more in 13 games in 2016 and 25 in 13 games in 2015. Bateman's 86-yard catch at Illinois is the team's longest of the year and longest since 2003 (school record 96 yards, Asad Abdul-Khaliq to Jared Ellerson at Northwestern). Minnesota leads the Big Ten and ranks No. 12 in the nation in yards per completion at 14.66

Minnesota has had four running backs rush for more than 100 yards in a game this year in Mohamed Ibrahim (101 vs. New Mexico State and 157 at Ohio State), Rodney Smith (153 vs. New Mexico State), Bryce Williams (141 vs. Miami) and Shannon Brooks (154 vs. Indiana). This is the first time in school history that Minnesota has had four different backs record 100-yard games (according to stats dating back to 1942). Four different players have rushed for 100 yards in a season before, but one was always the quarterback. Smith and Brooks are out for the year with injuries.

The Gophers have 112 players on the roster and 58 of those players - or 51.7 percent - are freshmen. That's the highest number in the nation. Virginia is next at 50 percent and is followed by Wake Forest (49.1 percent) and UCF (48.03 percent). The Gophers have 78 underclassmen (69.6% of the roster), which ranks tenth in college football.

The OAR = The ENERGY! The symbol of strength and purpose. The amount one brings to their life Academically, Athletically, Socially and Spiritually! The only tool that can move the boat forward!

**FUTURE:** When rowing a boat, as in life, you aren't able to see what is coming your way. Your back is actually facing the future, unable to see what's coming next. Facing the opposite direction can be a very scary and uncomfortable position to be in. However, as in life, worrying about the future only prohibits you from being your absolute best in the present. You aren't able to control the future, but you can control how you react and prepare for it with every stroke you take.

PRESENT: You are rowing in the present, which is the ONLY thing you can actually control while rowing a boat. You determine whether you take your oar out of the water or keep rowing. ## ABOUT THE BOILERMAKERS

Purdue (5-4 overall, 4-2 Big Ten) comes to Minnesota after a 38-36 home win against No. 19 Iowa. Purdue has won five of its last six games and has victories against three ranked teams this season.

Spencer Evans connected on a 25-yard field goal with eight seconds left to push Purdue past lowa. Senior receiver Terry Wright totaled six receptions for a career-high 146 yards and three touchdowns in the victory.

Senior quarterback David Blough completed 22-of-33 passes for 333 yards and four touchdown against lowa. Blough has played in all nine games and has eight starts for the Purdue this season. He

has thrown for 2,683 yards and 17 touchdowns. Purdue averages 330.3 passing yards per game which ranks No. 7 in the NCAA and No. 2 in the Big Ten.

Senior D.J. Knox has led the rushing attack with 753 yards and eight touchdowns. Senior Markell Jones also sees plenty of carries and has 346 yards and three touchdowns this season.

Freshman Ronald Moore leads the Big Ten with more than 170 all-purpose yards per game and is first in the nation with 74 receptions. He has 833 yards and seven touchdowns. Moore also handles the returning duties for Purdue and has 459 yards kick return yards and 82 punt return yards.

Purdue is averaging 485.9 yards per game which is No. 13 in the NCAA and No. 2 in the Big Ten. They rank No. 12 in the country and No. 4 in the Big Ten in red zone offense with 37 scores on 40 attempts.

Junior linebacker Markus Bailey leads the defense with 77 tackles, 3,5 sacks, 6.5 tackles for loss, a forced fumble and an interception.

The Boilermakers are led by second-year head coach Jeff Brohm. Prior to Purdue, Brohm spent three seasons at Western Kentucky and led them to back-to-back double-digit win seasons.



#### HEAD COACH // SECOND SEASON

P.J. (Philip John) Fleck was named head football coach at the University of Minnesota on January 6, 2017. Fleck is the 30th head coach in the program's history. He has a career record of 39-34.

Fleck led a young and inexperienced Gopher squad in 2017, as 49 of Minnesota's 110 players (44.5%) were freshmen or redshirt freshmen and 76 (69%) were underclassmen. Fleck guided Minnesota to a 5-7 record and those five wins were the most by a first-year Gopher head coach new to the program since the legendary Murray Warmath won seven games in 1954.

Fleck won his Gopher debut against Buffalo, which made him the school's first head coach to win his debut since John Gutekunst in 1986 (before Fleck, Minnesota's six most recent head coaches all lost their first game). Minnesota then posted a dominating 48-14 win at Oregon State, which made Fleck the first Gopher coach to win a true road opener since 1954.

Minnesota's 34-point win at Oregon State was the Gophers' tenth largest margin of victory in a road game since 1920 and largest since 2006. The 48 points were the most the Gophers scored on the road since they beat Northwestern 49-21 in 1980. Minnesota posted three 30-point wins in 2017, as it beat Oregon State by 34, Nebraska by 33 and Middle Tennessee by 31. The last time Minnesota won three games by 30 points in the same season was 2005 when it started the year with three straight with three straight 30-point wins. The Gophers beat Nebraska 54-21 in Fleck's first season. The 54 points were the most that the Gophers scored in a Big Ten game since they beat Indiana 63-26 in 2006. The 54 points were the 14th most scored by Minnesota since 1946 and the fifth most against a Big Ten opponent in the same timeframe.

Off the field, Fleck and his team can often be found at the University of Minnesota Masonic Children's Hospital and gave back to the community by hosting a diaper drive, canned food drive and turkey drive last year. In the classroom, Minnesota has posted program record GPAs under Fleck.

Fleck came to Minnesota after spending four years as the head coach at Western Michigan, where he was 30-22 overall and 21-11 in the Mid-American Conference. While leading the Broncos, Fleck authored one of the most memorable turnarounds in college football history. The Broncos were 1-11 in his first year in 2013, but ended the 2016 season with a No. 12 ranking, a 13-1 record, a conference championship and a berth in the Cotton Bowl.

The Broncos were 12-0 in the 2016 regular season and posted wins against Big Ten opponents Northwestern and Illinois. Fleck then led his team to a 29-23 win against Ohio in the Mid-American Conference championship game before ending the season with a narrow bowl game defeat to Wisconsin.

Fleck, 37, is one the youngest and brightest minds in the game. He was named MAC Coach of the Year in 2014 and 2016 and last season he led the Broncos to their first MAC Championship since 1988.

Fleck played receiver at Northern Illinois from 1999-2003 and helped lead the Huskies to a No. 10 ranking, a 10-2 record and wins against Maryland, Alabama and Iowa State in his final season. He ranks in the top five in Northern Illinois history in career receptions (179) and receiving yards (2,162). Fleck holds the school record for punt returns (87) and ranks second in punt return yards (716). He earned First Team All-Mid-American Conference in 2003 and was named Academic All-MAC and Second Team CoSIDA Academic All-American. He graduated in 2004 with a bachelor's degree in elementary education.

Fleck played the 2004-05 seasons with the NFL's San Francisco 49ers. He signed with the 49ers as a free agent in 2004 and spent most of his time on the practice squad before seeing action against New England late in the season. He spent the 2005 season on the injured reserve roster and in 2006 he stopped playing professionally and started his coaching career.

Fleck and Michigan's Jim Harbaugh are the only Power Five conference coaches who both played and coached in the NFL. Fleck, Harbaugh and East Carolina's Scottie Montgomery are the only coaches in the FBS who have played and coached in the NFL.

Fleck and his wife, Heather, have four children, Gavin, Carter, Paisley (P.J.) and Harper.

## FRESHMEN OUARTERBACKS

- For the second straight season Minnesota started the year with the most inexperienced quarterbacks in the nation. This year, Minnesota has three redshirt freshmen quarterbacks in Tanner Morgan, Samuel Pickerign and Jon Santaga (moved from defensive back to quarterback in the spring) on its roster and true freshman walk-on Zack Annexstad, who started the first seven games. Annexstad is believed to be just the second ever true freshman walk-on to start a season opener, joining Baker Mayfield who did so in 2013 at Texas Tech. Minnesota is the only team in the nation that has all freshmen quarterbacks on the roster.
- Through seven games, Zack Annexstad has completed 97-of-187 passes for 1,277 yards (second most ever for a Gopher freshman) and nine touchdowns (third all-time for a Gopher freshman). Five of Annexstad's touchdowns have gone to Tyler Johnson, while three have been caught by Rashod Bateman and one by Demetrius Douglas. Annexstad started the season 3-0 and was the first Gopher freshman quarterback ever to win his first three career starts having not played previously. Freshmen became eligible in 1972.
- Zack Annexstad was the first true freshman to start a season-opening game at quarterback for the Gophers since Tim Salem got the call in 1980 (Salem passed for 162 yards in the season opener) playing for his father and coach Joe Salem. Dating back to 1980, only redshirt freshman Alan Holt's 275 yards passing against Michigan State in 1985 were better in a Gopher freshman's (true or redshirt) debut than Annexstad's 220 yards against New Mexico State. Rickey Foggie (1984, 62 yards) and Max Shortell (2011, 98 yards) played as true freshmen in season-opening games, but as reserves because of injuries. Redshirt freshmen Asad Abdul-Khaliq (2000, 161 yards) and Adam Weber (2007, 188 yards) also started their season-openers.
- Zack Annexstad turned down multiple Power 5 scholarship offers to walk-on at Minnesota in January 2018. He attended IMG Academy in Bradenton, Fla., and was named the starting quarterback midway through his senior season. As a senior, he completed 63-of-112 passes for 940 yards and 10 touchdowns as the Ascenders went undefeated. Annexstad was the starting quarterback at Mankato West (Mankato, Minn.) as a sophomore in 2015, but was sidelined by an ankle injury. He then continued his high school career at IMG. His brother, Brock, is a receiver for the Gophers and his father, Scott, played at the U from 1982-83 before playing with Kansas City and Washington in the NFL. Annexstad's cousin Sam Dekker plays basketball for the Cleveland Cavaliers.
- Tanner Morgan is the only scholarship quarterback on the team. He attended Ryle High School in Kentucky where he played as a junior and a senior (played first two years at Hazard HS) before enrolling at Minnesota in January 2017. Morgan is one of only a few Kentucky high school quarterbacks to pass for more than 10,000 career yards. As a senior, he passed for 2,747 yards and 27 touchdowns as Ryle finished 12-1. Morgan was named a finalist for Kentucky's Mr. Football award. Morgan has played in five games this season and started against Indiana and Illinois. He has completed 44-of-73 passes (60.2%) for 809 yards and five touchdowns. He has also rushed for one score. Morgan's cousin Tim Couch played at Kentucky and spent five seasons with the Cleveland Browns.
- Minnesota threw for a total of 349 yards at Nebraska, as Zack Annexstad completed nine passes for 135 yards in the first half and Tanner Morgan completed 11 passes for 214 yards in the second half (Morgan replaced an injured Annexstad to start the second half). The 349 passing yards were the most for the Gophers since Adam Weber threw for 373 yards against Northern Illinois in 2010. The 349 yards were the most for the Gophers in a Big Ten game since Weber threw for 416 yards against Michigan State in 2009 and were the most in a Big Ten road game since Asad-Abdul-Khaliq threw for 388 yards at lowa in 2003.
- Against Indiana, Tanner Morgan completed 17-of-24 passes (70.8 percent) for 302 yards and three touchdowns in his first career start. His 302 passing yards ranks fourth all-time by a Minnesota freshman quarterback since 1980 and is the most in the same timeframe for a freshman making his first career start. Morgan's 302 yards were the most by a freshman since Adam Weber's 352-yard game against Wisconsin in 2007. It was also Minnesota's first 300-yard individual passing game since Mitch Leidner threw for 317 yards against Michigan in 2015. Morgan found Rashod Bateman for a 67-yard game-winning touchdown with 1:34 left versus Indiana.
- Minnesota (Zack Annexstad, Tanner Morgan and Seth Green) has passed for 2,111 yards and 15 touchdowns this year. Those numbers are already better than what Minnesota did in 12 games in 2017 (1,513 yards and nine TDs). Minnesota threw for 2,257 yards and nine touchdowns in 2016 and 2,793 yards and 15 touchdowns in 2015. The U last threw for more than 15 scores in 2012 (19).

## RUNNING BACKS

- Rodney Smith suffered a season-ending injury against Fresno State. Minnesota will file a waiver for a sixth year of eligibility for Smith at the end of the season. Smith rushed 25 times for 154 yards this year and added 32 receiving yards and 37 kick return yards. In 39 career games, he has rushed 651 times (fifth all-time), for 2,959 yards (seventh all-time) and 21 touchdowns (tied for ninth in school history). His 4,073 all-purpose yards (2,959 rushing, 451 receiving and 663 kick return) ranks seventh in school history.
- Shannon Brooks returned from injury and made his season debut against Indiana. He rushed 22 times (tied career high) for 154 yards (third most in career) and a touchdown before leaving the game with an injury in the fourth quarter. Fleck has since said that Brooks will miss the rest of the season with an injury. Brooks has rushed 358 times for 1,882 yards (18th in school history) in 29 games. He has rushed for 18 touchdowns, caught two touchdowns and passed for one. Minnesota is 12-2 when he scores.
- Freshman Mohamed Ibrahim started his career with 101 yards on nine carries against New Mexico State to become the first Gopher to rush for 100 yards or more in his collegiate debut since Thomas Hamner (158 yards vs. NE Louisiana in 1996). He rushed for a career high 157 yards (most for a freshman back vs. Buckeyes since Saquan Barkley in 2015) and scored twice at Ohio State. He has missed three games with an injury, but has 107 carries this year for 562 yards and five touchdowns.

## WILDCAT SUCCESS

Seth Green has rushed for seven touchdowns as a Wildcat quarterback this year. He also converted a two-point against Fresno State and threw a touchdown (7 yards to Tyler Johnson) against Miami. He has rushed 53 times for 192 yards and he has also caught one pass for 31 yards. The last Gopher to run, pass and catch a touchdown in one season was running back Duane Bennett (2010). Current running back Shannon Brooks has also rushed, passed and thrown for a touchdown, but not in the same season.

## MORE THAN FOUR

The following true freshmen have played in more than four games and will not redshirt: Zack Annexstad, Rashod Bateman, Daniel Faalele, Jordan Howden, Max Janes, Thomas Rush, Benny Sapp, Terell Smith and Bryce Williams. Minnesota starts seven freshmen on offense, which is the most in the nation (BYU has started six this year), in Blaise Andries (OL), Daniel Faalele (OL), Zack Annexstad/Tanner Morgan (QB), Chris Autman-Bell (WR), Rashod Bateman (WR), Jake Paulson (TE) and Mohamed Ibrahim (RB). On defense, Minnesota has started freshman Terell Smith (DB) and Jordan Howden (DB).

## **HEATING UP**

Minnesota finished the Illinois game with 438 yards of total offense (178 rush/260 pass) and has averaged 447.5 yards of total offense in the last four games. The Gophers had 482 yards against Indiana (180 rush/302 pass), 474 (125 rush/349 pass) at Nebraska and 396 (178 rush/218 pass) at Ohio State. Minnesota had a 99-yard touchdown drive in the second quarter against Indiana. It was the longest scoring drive for the Gophers since it also went 99 yards at Northwestern on Oct. 4, 2003.

## A CERTIFIED STAR

- ▶ Tyler Johnson exploded onto the scene last year with 35 catches for 677 yards and seven touchdowns. Through nine games this season, he has hauled in 57 balls for 875 yards (8th in NCAA, 1st in B1G). The Minnesota single season receiving record is 1,125 yards set by Ron Johnson in 2000. Tyler Johnson is 250 yards shy of Ron Johnson's record and needs to average 83.3 yards in the remaining three games to tie the record. Johnson has 106 career catches (15th in school history) for 1,693 yards (10th in school history) and 16 touchdowns (fifth in school history).
- Tyler Johnson has nine career 100-yard games, which is tied for third in school history. He is averaging 97.2 yards per game, which ranks first in the Big Ten and 12th in the NCAA. He has six 100-yard games this year, which ranks first in school history with Ryan Thelwell (1996). Johnson had a streak of four straight 100-yard games snapped at Illinois (5 catches for 68 yards), as he had 107 yards against lowa, 119 at Ohio State, 184 at Nebraska and 102 versus Indiana. He is the only Gopher in school history to have four straight 100 yard games in Big Ten play and he tied Eric Decker's record of four straight 100-yard games. Decker did so from 12/31/08 to 9/18/09 (vs. Kansas, at Syracuse, vs. Air Force and vs. California).
- Tyler Johnson had a career day against Nebraska. He caught 11 passes (third-most ever for a Gopher) for 184 yards (seventh most in a single game for a Gopher and most since Eric Decker had 190 vs. Indiana in 2008).
- ▶ Tyler Johnson's 677 receiving yards in 2017 were the fifth most ever by a Gopher sophomore and that was despite missing the final two games with an injury. His seven receiving touchdowns were the second most ever by a sophomore. To crack the top five as a junior he will need 60 catches (currently at 57) and his 875 yards are the fourth most ever by a Gopher junior. Ron Johnson's 11 TDs as a junior is first in school history (Tyler Johnson has 8).

- ▶ In 19 games with receiver coach Matt Simon, Tyler Johnson has caught 92 passes for 1,552 yards and 15 touchdowns. Those numbers alone would rank him 17th in career receptions, 13th in career yards and tied for fifth in touchdowns. The 16.8 average yards per catch would rank sixth.
- ➤ Tyler Johnson caught three touchdowns this year against Miami to tie his career high. He also caught three (all in fourth quarter) last year against Michigan State. Johnson is the second Gopher to catch three touchdowns in a game twice, joining Da'Jon McKnight (2010 vs. Penn State and 2011 at Michigan State).

## A STAR IS BORN

- Rashod Bateman had a career day at Illinois and is breaking Minnesota freshman receiving records. The true freshman caught seven balls (tied his career high) for 175 yards (career high) and two touchdowns (ties his career high) against the Illini.
- ▶ Rashod Bateman could to be the most productive freshman receiver ever at Minnesota. He has 42 catches for 578 yards and six touchdowns (all TDs in B1G play). His 42 catches is a freshman record (broke Ron Johnson's record of 38 set in 1998) and his 578 receiving yards ranks second in school history by a freshman. He needs 77 yards to break Ernie Wheelwright's 2004 record of 654 yards and two more touchdowns to break Wheelwright's record of seven.
- Rashod Bateman's last three touchdowns have covered 86 (at Illinois), 67 (vs. Indiana) and 61 (at Illinois) yards. His first three scores covered 17 (at Maryland), seven (vs. Iowa) and three (vs. Iowa) yards.
- Rashod Bateman caught an 86-yard touchdown from Tanner Morgan at Illinois. It was Minnesota's sixthlongest pass since 1971 and longest for the U since Asad Abdul-Khaliq's school-record 96-yard touchdown to Jared Ellerson at Northwestern on Oct. 4, 2003.
- Rashod Bateman followed up a 108-yard output against Indiana with 175 yards at Illinois for his second straight 100-yard game. His 175 yards at Illinois were the most by a freshman since Ryan Thelwell's 178 yards versus Northwestern on Oct. 15, 1994.

## **AUTMAN-BELL, DOUGLAS**

► Freshmen Chris Autman-Bell and Demetrius Douglas have provided depth at receiver for the Gophers. Autman-Bell is a sure-handed target who has made 20 catches for 325 yards. He leads the Gophers with a 16.75 average per catch (minimum five catches). Demetrius Douglas was granted a medical hardship waiver from the NCAA after playing in three games last season. He has seven catches for 78 yards and one touchdown, but has six catches for 74 yards in the last three games. Douglas' father, Omar, played at Minnesota from 1990-93 and is tied for eighth in receptions (130), for ninth in receiving touchdowns (14) and tenth in school history in receiving yards (1,681). Omar, owns school record for touchdowns in a game with five (Oct. 9, 1993 vs. Purdue) and spent four years in the NFL with the New York Giants.

## TWO FOR 100

 Tyler Johnson (102 yards) and Rashod Bateman (108 yards) both had more than 100 yards against Indiana.
 It was the first time that Minnesota had two receivers total more than 100 yards in a game since Ernie Wheelwright (116 yards) and Logan Payne (137 yards) did so against Indiana in 2006. KJ Maye (106 yards and Brandon Lingen (105 yards) did so against lowa, but Lingen was a tight end.

## **RECORD WIN**

Minnesota's 38-point margin of victory (won 48-10) against New Mexico State was its largest ever at TCF Bank Stadium. Minnesota had previously beaten lowa (2014) and New Hampshire (2012) by 37 points at TCF Bank Stadium. The 38-point win was Minnesota's largest victory margin since 2006 (beat Temple 62-0).

## A LOT OF CHOCOLATE MILK

- Up front the Gophers feature a mix of experience and youth, as Minnesota has started two upperclassmen and three underclassmen on the offensive line.
- As a fifth-year senior, Jared Weyler is the most tenured of the group, but Donnell Greene has played the most football for the Gophers. Greene, who joined Minnesota as a junior college transfer in 2016, has started 26 of his 33 career games. He has started seven games this year (did not start against Indiana and missed the Illinois game with an injury) after starting 11 of 12 games in 2017 and the final eight of 2016. He was All-Big Ten Honorable Mention in 2017.
- Jared Weyler has started at center in all nine games this year, a position that he started six games for Minnesota at last season but also missed six games due to an injury. Weyler has already earned a minor in Leadership and his undergraduate degree, as he double majored in Accounting and Entrepreneurial Management. He is prepping for the CPA exam.
- Conner Olson started all 12 games (six at center, six at right guard) last season as a redshirt freshman, but has started all nine games at guard this year. The Monticello, Minn. native was 240 pounds when he was recruited, but is now 300 pounds. He credits his gain to chocolate milk and peanut butter sandwiches.
- Two more Minnesotans in sophomore Sam Schlueter (Victoria) and redshirt freshman Blaise Andries (Marshall) have seen extended action this year. Andries has started all eight games, while Schlueter has started seven. Andries, who is an aspiring actuary, made his collegiate debut this year.
- ▶ Daniel Faalele, who is 6-8 and 400 pounds, replaced Schlueter at tackle to start the second half against lowa and has started the last four games. The massive freshman from Australia has played six games this year. He is still new to American football. Faalele attended IMG Academy in 2016 and 2017. He only practiced in 2016, but then played in 2017. This is his second season ever of playing in a game.

## SQUEAKY CLEAN

Clean football has been a staple of Coach Fleck's teams and this season is no different. The Gophers rank No. 5 in the country in fewest penalties per game at 4.11 and are No. 5 in fewest penalties at 37. The Gophers were called for nine penalties against New Mexico State, but have since been penalized only 28 times in the last eight games.

## Ski-U-Mah // Row The Boat

The Gophers ranked first in the nation last season - Fleck's first as coach - in fewest penalties (39), fewest penalties per game (3.25), fewest penalty yards (340) and fewest penalty yards per game (28.33). It was a sharp contrast from 2016 when Minnesota ranked 91st in fewest penalties (88), 89th in fewest penalties per game (6.77), 86th in fewest penalty yards (743) and 80th in fewest penalty yards per game (57.15). Minnesota committed 49 fewer penalties in 2017 than 2016 and the difference in yards penalized was 403.

## TOM-BOMB

Thomas Barber emerged as a breakout star last season. The legacy Gopher started all 12 games and finished first on the team with 115 tackles to rank third in the Big Ten and tied for 20th in the nation. The junior linebacker is having another strong season in 2018. He is third on the team with 58 tackles, has one interception and one fumble recovery. He had eight tackles including a team leading seven solo tackles against Miami. He also notched one for a loss that resulted in a safety. He recorded another seven tackles against Maryland and hit double-digits with 10 tackles including one for a loss against lowa. On top of that he scooped up a fumble and took it down to the seven-yard line. Against Ohio State, he recorded nine tackles, added another seven against Nebraska and finished with eight against Indiana. Barber does not have a single defensive penalty in his entire career despite seeing almost every single defensive snap as the "Mike" linebacker the past two seasons. According to Pro Football Focus, he has played 1,242 defensive snaps (24 in 2016, 747 in 2017 and 468 in 2018) in college. The only penalty of his career came on a special teams play when he was called for holding against Northwestern as a freshman in 2016.

## **SACKED BY COUGHLIN**

- ► Carter Coughlin has nine sacks (5th in NCAA, 1st in B1G) this season after recording a team-best 6.5 last year. Coughlin's speed has caused fits for offensive linemen since he transitioned from linebacker to a rush end role last season. He has been on an absolute tear with 13 sacks in his last 15 games.
- Carter Coughlin's sack against Indiana puts him seventh all-time in school history for sacks in a season. He is on his way to a double-digit sack season, which has been done only six times at Minnesota and not since 2008 when Willie VanDeSteeg had 10.5 sacks. Coughlin's 17.5 career sacks has him in fifth all-time for career sacks in Gophers history. Willie VanDeSteeg is fourth with 21.5 career sacks and Karon Riley holds the school record with 29 career sacks. Coughlin has done the majority of his damage against Big Ten foes with 11.5 of his career sacks coming in Big Ten play. He has four multi-sack games in his career including three against Big Ten teams.
- Carter Coughlin has 14 tackles for loss (14th in NCAA, 1st in B1G) after a team-best 11.5 in 2017. He has recorded at least one tackle for loss in every game this season and has notched 17 tackles for loss in his last 13 games. He has 29.5 career tackles for loss which ranks him eighth all-time in school history. Coughlin has forced three fumbles this season (11th in NCAA, 1st in B1G). Two gave Minnesota the ball deep in opponent territory with one going on to produce a touchdown and another sealed a victory against Indiana.

## STRAIGHT CASH HOMEY

- ▶ Blake Cashman has made his money on special teams throughout his career but he has been a dynamic playmaker on defense for the Gophers this year as one of the top producing linebackers in the entire Big Ten. He leads the team with 72 tackles (No. 8 in the Big Ten), a team leading 45 solo tackles (No. 5 in the Big Ten) and is second on the team with 12 tackles for loss (No. 4 in the Big Ten). He was named to the Pro Football Focus midseason All-Big Ten First Team. He has been the top graded Gopher by PFF in four games this season.
- ▶ Blake Cashman tied a TCF Bank Stadium record with four tackles for loss against New Mexico State. PFF charted him with five total quarterback hurries on just eight pass rush snaps. Cashman would add a sack and a pass breakup and then notched 10 tackles against Fresno State. He set a new career high against now No. 2 Ohio State with 13 tackles including two for a loss and one pass breakup. He also came up with a big stop on a fourth-and-one for Ohio State deep in Minnesota territory. Cashman helped stall an Indiana comeback with a late game third-and-one stop. The Gophers offense would go on to score the game winning touchdown right after.
- ▶ Blake Cashman finished last season with 30 tackles including five for a loss and two sacks. As a sophomore he recorded 45 tackles with a team leading 7.5 sacks and one forced fumble. He was named the 2017 Holiday Bowl Defensive Most Valuable Player and is a two-time winner of the team's Gary Tinsley Award, as the player who best embodied the underdog spirit of the late Gary Tinsley. He has 10.5 career sacks and 28 tackles for loss. He is tenth in Minnesota history in tackles for loss.
- ▶ Off the field Blake Cashman runs his own nonprofit called "Athletes Answer to Hunger." It's a nonprofit that brings athletes together to pack meals and send to people struggling with food insecurity. Cashman started it going into his senior year of high school. He has worked with teams across the state and ran a Minnesota athletics department wide drive his freshman year. The football team plans to take part in one more drive together before Cashman graduates.

## **ANOTHER MINNESOTA LB**

On top of Coughlin (Eden Prairie), Cashman (Eden Prairie), Barber (Plymouth), the Gophers have another standout linebacker from Minnesota in Kamal Martin out of Burnsville. Martin is fourth on the team with 50 tackles including 3.5 for loss and has two pass breakups this season. He has 103 career tackles in 34 games of action including 11.5 for loss in his career. He had a career high ten tackles against Nebraska.

## REPLACING WINFIELD

- ▶ Antoine Winfield Jr. was granted a medical hardship by the NCAA in 2017 and was off to a spectacular 2018 season before suffering an injury on the first drive of the game against Maryland. He started the season with two viral moments. He helped swing the game against New Mexico State by taking his first ever punt return 76 yards to the house and made an interception in the end zone to beat Fresno State.
- Antonio Shenault moved to safety against lowa while Jacob Huff holds down the other safety spot. Shenault

has played in 40 career games while Huff has 42 games under his belt. Shenault has 42 tackles this year and 2.5 tackles for loss, one forced fumble and one interception. He set a career high with 13 tackles at Ohio State. Ten of those 13 tackles were solo. Huff has 37 solo stops and is second on the team with 59 tackles. He helped Minnesota score late in the first half against lowa by returning an interception 21 yards to the 6-yard line. He also has five pass breakups and one forced fumble and is Minnesota's top graded player by Pro Football Focus with an 81.1 mark.

Freshman walk-on Jordan Howden has been the next man up at safety. He recorded a career high eight tackles (four solo) against Nebraska and had a break-out performance against Indiana with seven tackles, a career high three pass breakups and his first career interception. Against the Hoosiers, Howden was the Gophers top graded defensive player by Pro Football Focus with a 75.6. Howden led the Gophers in tackles against Illinois with nine including eight solo stops. As a senior in high school, Howden out of Las Vegas, Nev., notched 45 tackles and three interceptions while earning All-Conference honors. He also won the NIAA 3A State Championship in the long jump (21-05.00) and was on the relay teams that took first in the 4x100 (42.70) and 4x200 (1:28.87).

## T-TIME

True freshman Terell Smith has 36 tackles, seven pass breakups and one interception this year. His seven pass breakups are more than any Gopher had in 2017. Smith brings elite speed to the team, as he won the Georgia State Championship in the 100m (10.39) as a junior and the 200m (21.26) as a sophomore. His personal record in the 100m is 10.32 and in the 200m is 20.84, which made him the fastest Big Ten corner commit since 2010.

## A CARPENTER'S PRECISION

- Emmit Carpenter's 46 career field goals ranks third in school history. He has made 46-of-57 career field goals and his 80.7 field goal conversion rate ranks first in program history. Carpenter has made 29-of-37 field goals at TCF Bank Stadium, 16-of-19 on the road and 1-of-1 in neutral-site games. Carpenter is 40-of-51 on FieldTurf and is a perfect 6-of-6 on natural grass. He has made 102-of-103 career point-after attempts, which includes a current streak of 65. His 65 straight point-after attempts is second in school history to Dan Nystrom is first (83).
- Through nine games, Emmit Carpenter has made 10-of-13 field goal and all 28 point-after attempts. He now has 240 career points as he has made 102 PATs and 46 field goals. Carpenter's 240 points ranks him third among kickers all time and fourth among all players.
- ▶ Entering the Ohio State game, Emmit Carpenter had made six straight field goals (53, 50, 44, 33, 41, 49). His streak ended when he missed from 32 yards in the third quarter (would also miss from 49 yards in the fourth quarter) at Ohio State. In 2016, Carpenter had made streaks of 12 and nine. Dan Nystrom is the only Gopher with three streaks of seven-straight made field goals (ended career with streaks of 16, 14 and 13).
- ► Emmit Carpenter made field goals from 50 and 53 yards versus Fresno State. The 53-yard kick tied his career-long, as he also made a 53-yarder in a 44-31

win against Purdue in 2016. It was the second time in his career he's made two field goals greater than 50 yards (52 and 53 versus Purdue in 2016). Adam Bailey is the only other Gopher kicker with two field goals from 50-plus yards (52, 50) in the same game (vs. Pen State in 1997 indoors at the Metrodome).

- In 2017, Carpenter made 14-of-20 field goals and was a perfect 31-of-31 on point-after attempts. He led Minnesota with 73 points. In 2016, Carpenter was the Big Ten's Bakken-Andersen Kicker of the Year (first Gopher to be honored), after making 22-of-24 field goals. He was named All-Big Ten First Team by the media. Carpenter totaled 109 points, which tied Dan Nystrom (109 points in 2000) for most all-time by a Minnesota kicker. Carpenter's 109 points ranks tied for second all-time with Nystrom for any Gopher behind Gary Russell (114 points in 2005) and he finished fifth in the Big Ten scoring race that season. He was a perfect 10-of-10 on field goals from 40 yards or greater and was the only kicker in the nation - minimum six kicks - to do that (8-of-8 from 40-49 yards and 2-of-2 from 50-plus yards).
- Emmit Carpenter is a two-time CoSida Academic All-District honoree and has received the team's Tony Dungy Character and Community Service Award.

## SPECIAL BROTHERHOOD

▶ The Gophers are in the third straight season of having the same long snapper (Payton Jordahl), holder (Jacob Herbers) and kicker (Emmit Carpenter). Jordahl has snapped 472 times in his career (261 punt, 133 PATs and 78 FGs) and has made 10 tackles and recovered one fumble. Herbers is on the Mortell Holder of the Year watch list. He is averaging 41.46 yards on 43 punts and has placed 16 inside the 20. Minnesota has yielded only 10 punt return yards this year. Not bad for an Eagle Scout and mechanical engineering major. As mentioned, Carpenter is an amazing person and kicker.

## **MOST IMPORTANT PLAY**

Minnesota has seen success on both punt teams. The Gophers have blocked two punts this season (Sam Renner and Justus Harris), have returned a punt for a touchdown (Antoine Winfield Jr.) and have allowed only 10 punt return yards all season on eight returns (4th in NCAA, 1st in B1G at 1.25 yards per return). The Gophers are ninth in the NCAA and first in the Big Ten in punt returns as they average 17.90 yards.

## SCHOLARSHIP SURPRISE

Nobody gives away a scholarship like Minnesota coach P.J. Fleck. He certainly has a flair for the dramatic when it comes to scholarship surprises, as he ensures that the moment is one that is memorable. Since Fleck was hired on Jan. 6, 2017, he has awarded eight scholarships to walk-ons, with three coming in the last few months. Bailey Schoenfelder was awarded a scholarship after two Navy Seals parachuted onto the field and delivered a letter to Fleck. Brock Annexstad received a scholarship when his brother, starting quarterback Zack, pretended to reveal a tattoo to the team that showed the words, "Brock, you are on scholarship." After Minnesota beat New Mexico State, Fleck awarded a scholarship to Calvin Swenson while he was addressing the team in the locker room. Fleck had previously given scholarships to walk-ons Sam Renner, Blake Cashman, Emmit Carpenter, Justin Juenemann, and Conor Rhoda.

## **DEGREE IN HAND**

Minnesota has eight players who have already earned their degree. They are Jerry Gibson, Payton Jordahl, Gary Moore, Rodney Smith, Jared Weyler, Julian Huff, Sam Renner and Alex Melvin.

## COACHED UP

- Head coach P.J. Fleck named Joe Rossi interim defensive coordinator on Nov. 4, 2018. Rossi was previously promoted from quality control assistant to defensive line coach in the offseason. He also hired Clay Patterson (TEs), Jahmile Addae (DBs) and Marcus West (DL pass rush specialist prior to the season.
- Joe Rossi joined the staff in January 2017 and was named defensive line coach in January 2018. Rossi spent 2012-15 at Rutgers, which included two years as defensive coordinator. Rossi was also the defensive coordinator at Maine and Thiel College.
- Clay Patterson joined the Minnesota coaching staff in January 2018 after serving as head coach at Northeastern Oklahoma A&M for two seasons. The Morris, Okla., native led the Norseman to a 9-3 record in 2017 after going 5-5 in 2016. In 2017, the program claimed its first Southwest Junior College Football Conference (SWJCFC) championship since 2003 and played in its first bowl game since 2012. Patterson earned conference coach of the year honors as his team averaged 524.5 yards per game (253.8 rushing and 270.6 passing) and 36.2 points per game.
- ▶ Jahmile Addae coached Arizona defensive backs in 2016-17 after working for the team as an analyst from 2013-15. At Arizona, Addae helped develop Arizona's young defensive backs into top performers. Four of Arizona's leading tacklers were in the secondary in 2017 and that quartet combined for 261 tackles, 24 breakups and 12 interceptions.
- ▶ Marcus West came to Minnesota after two seasons at Austin Peay. With the Governors, West was the assistant head coach, co-defensive coordinator and defensive line coach. In 2017, Austin Peay which was a combined 1-45 from 2013-16 posted an 8-4 record. The defense, led by West, held its opponents to 24.8 points per game, which is impressive considering it gave up 73 points at UCF. Excluding UCF, Austin Peay gave up 20.3 points per game in 11 games and gave up 16.6 points per game in its eight wins.

## **PLAYING AT HOME**

- Minnesota is 40-28 all-time at TCF Bank Stadium. Minnesota is 12 games over .500 at TCF Bank Stadium, which is its best mark at the stadium. The Gophers opened the on-campus facility with a 20-13 win against Air Force on Sept. 12, 2009, but then dropped to 7-13 at home after 20 games. Since then (Nov. 26, 2011), Minnesota is 33-15 at home, which translates to a 68.75 winning percentage.
- ▶ In 68 games at TCF Bank Stadium, the Gophers average 27.2 points and allow 24.3. In non-conference games, Minnesota averages 29.1 points and give up 19.7. Under Fleck, Minnesota is 8-4 at home and has averaged 28.6 points and has allowed an average of 20.5. In five non-conference games, those numbers are 29.2 points for and 7.4 points against.
